### PLAGUE COSTS MONEY

(United Press Leased Wire.)

San Francisco, March 6.—At a special meeting of the Oakland city council, that body appropriated \$20,000 for the month of March to continue the war against the bubonic plague, signified its willingness to appropriate a like sum for each month as long as necessary, doomed the disease breeding public dumps in West Oakland, instructed the board of public works to make adequate arrangements at once to carry all garbage out, to set and revoke the franchise of the Pacific Incinerating Company, and finally turned over in all its details the completeness to Dr. John D. Long, the task of exterminating the rats of the city. Dr. Long was empowered to increase the salaries of all men under him, most of whose wages had been cut when the monthly appropriation was decreased from \$10,000 to \$5,000 and to employ as many men as he deems necessary.

### CANDIDAE FOR COUNTY JUDGE WHO HAS GOOD RECORD.

Mr. Bushey has been employed by several different county officials to perform important clerical work, and in every instance his work has given satisfaction, because it could not be truthfully criticised and stood the severest test of time. For all the work Mr. Bushey has ever done for the county, whether it was surveying roads, copying records in the clerks office or extending rolls, or making footings of valuations for all the road districts and school districts in the county, his charges for his services have always been moderate. Until last year he never charged or received more than \$2.00 a day for his work, when others possessing the same ability would have jumped at the chance to run a big bill against the county. (Last year the county commissioners allowed him \$3.00 a day for his work as foreman over a force of clerks in extending the tax rolls. Mr. Bushey did not ask for this compensation but it was given him on account of generally prevailing high wages and was less than first class mechanics were receiving.) All his work for the city of Salem has been of the same character. When there was a controversy growing out of surveys of the streets that were ordered improved last year, and the differences between the contractors and the city could not be settled, Mr. Bushey was called in and his work was acceptable to both sides and was never questioned. The city council voluntarily tendered him the position of city engineer.

Mr. Bushey has never held an elective office in this county.

### LATEST SPRING STYLES

With the beginning of March maids and matrons alike begin to think longingly of the Easter hat and although it is full early to speak of these dainty creations until the millinery modes have already declared themselves and everywhere milliners are having openings and the "very latest fashions from Paris" are displayed. In fact among the spring coats there seems to be literally no end to the peculiar cuts that have been brought out.

**Stylish Costumes.**  
A novel spring suit is made of striped woolen with checked woolen in the same colors used as a trimming.

these are some large toque and turban shapes that are very smart indeed. Flowers are of course used for trimmings, as is always the case at this season of the year but a good many more feathers are seen than is usual in the spring and summer styles.

#### Some Smart Hats.

A medium sized hat of white cloth has the brim sloping down a little towards the back in the modified mushroom style. It is trimmed around the rather high crown with large pink roses and about them is a graceful draping of mousseline-de-sole worked in eyelet embroidery effect. Another stunning chapeau seen at an opening was a rather large shape of Copenhagen blue straw trimmed around the left side of the crown with a long ostrich plume that hung over the brim in the back. Across the front was one of the new broad bows made of inch and a half ribbon with two loops on each side of the knot. Then there was a large turban of soft brown straw, twisted and manipulated into artistic curves and folds. This was adorned on the left side with a soft bunch of ostrich plumes in dull shades of brown and tan that gave an indescribable softening touch to the face.

#### Jackets of Peculiar Cut.

A prominent feature of the spring

smart example of this style was in natural colored pongee made with a waist crossing in surplice effect in the front and having sleeve caps in Japanese style cut in one with the body of the garment. This was trimmed with bands of the material embroidered in red and light greys that come as a border on the fabric. The skirt was in one of the pretty triple styles.

#### Fashions for Children.

The large armhole and drooping shoulder effect are just as prominent in fashions for children this season as they are in adult modes. For spring wear many charming little frocks of mohair, panama, serge or flannel are displayed in the shops, also some most attractive little gingham dresses. These can be purchased in plaids, stripes, checks and plain colors. The skirts are in pleated effects, trimmed with folds, while the waists are in plain or fancy styles with lace trimmed yokes, or plain gingham trimmings that match the predominating color used in the plaid or check. The sleeves are either short or long, but the short kimono sleeve is extensively used. In more expansive frocks white is most in evidence and with these colored ribbons for sashes and trimmings, are universal.

### THE SCHOOL HOUSE FIRE VICTIMS

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Cleveland, O., March 7.—In the presence of a row of 16 coffins containing that many victims of the dreadful disaster at Collingwood, mass was said this morning in St. Mary's church. Similar services were conducted in St. Joseph's church. Several funerals will be held tomorrow and Monday.

The official report of the coroner shows that 167 bodies were found, 22 bodies still await identification. No trace of the remains of five pupils can be found. Their bodies were entirely consumed by the fire.

The body identified as that of Katherine Weiler, a teacher, whose home was in Pittsburg, has been discovered to be that of a man, presumably John Krajnyak, who disappeared at the time of the fire. It is thought he lost his life in trying to rescue some of the children. Miss Weiler has not been found, however, and it is believed that she perished also.

### WOMAN'S REJECTION PROVED TOO MUCH.
