

# VAN DUSEN CANNOT REMAIN

A Salem special says: The conference between the board of fish commissioners, the upper and lower river fishermen ended in disorder yesterday afternoon, hot words flying thick and fast from F. A. Seuffert, who hinted that Ed. Rosenberg, secretary of the Pacific Coast Fishermen's union, did not adhere to the truth and was "a coward foreigner and in case of war would go back to the country from which he emigrated." Rosenberg replied with hints of bribed commissions, which Seuffert has attended. The wordy war was stopped by Governor Chamberlain declaring the meeting adjourned just as the two representatives of the contending factions were getting closer together and Seuffert's sneers were getting more cutting and Rosenberg was getting redder in the face as the sarcasms fell rather plentifully about him.

The conference was the result of the arrival in this city Monday of Rosenberg, H. M. Lornsten, secretary of the Columbia River Fishermen's union, and I. J. Kerns, of Astoria, who asked for a conference with the board in the interest of Master Game Warden H. G. Van Dusen, who has been slated for removal, and, if possible, to secure the approval of the governor to the bill to come before the people next election to prevent fishing by fish-wheels in the upper Columbia. But the commission refused to hear them until the arrival of F. A. Seuffert, F. N. Warren and Walter Ridehalgh, of the Elmore Packing company, yesterday morning.

The entire morning was taken up by Rosenberg in discussing the fish-wheels in the upper Columbia and was continually interrupted by Seuffert, who, when he was not calling attention to Rosenberg not being a citizen of Oregon, was showing where the latter's information was faulty or "absolutely untrue."

In the afternoon F. A. Warren called attention to Van Dusen's reports, which he stated were "so full of inconsistencies that a schoolboy would have been ashamed to admit he was their author." He stated that he was willing that there should be a shorter season, no fishing on Sundays and many other string-nt regulations, provided that such legislation were applied to the lower river fishermen as well.

Governor Chamberlain spoke of Van Dusen as follows:

"I have gotten to that pass where I cannot trust a single statement of Mr. Van Dusen, and I hope that we will be able to bring a man into his position, whose reports we will be able to trust and who will be absolutely impartial. Van Dusen's course right along has been wobbly and it appears that during his term, the laws for the protection of salmon have become less and less stringent. I myself, feel that there is too much fishing both in the upper and lower Columbia."

Rosenberg, seeing the governor's attitude, made the rather peculiar suggestion that if he could not approve the lower river measure, "not to make any statement of his opinion."

In concluding, Governor Chamberlain stated plainly that Van Dusen would not be allowed to retain his job for long.
