



the cardboard made from straw or wood pulp in several ways. The passing of the peat pulp over the hot rolls in the process of manufacture brings to the surface the natural oil of the peat and makes the surface of the finished product waterproof and antiseptic.

Besides this advantage, it is lacking in the odor which strawboard or wood pulp paper possesses, and is extremely tough.

The product is used principally for brick lined Torrid Zone Furt ..... cartons by makers of breakfast foods Guaranteed gas, smoke and dust and for this purpose it is unexcelled. proof. Economical and durable, It is also valuable for making boxes and bags for storing furs and woolen articles, as it is never attacked by moths.

On account of the increasing cost of print paper, this quality will doubtless soon be made from peat. All that is required beyond the present process is a bleaching to reduce the brown paper to the desired whiteness .-- James Cooke Mills in the World Today.
