### JOSEPH JEFFERSON

#### ON THE ARTS

In a delightful article published in the March Uncle Remus Magazine, Walter Hale discusses the passing of the old New Orleans and illustrates the text with his own brilliant pen and ink sketches.

A meeting in that city some nine years ago with Joseph Jefferson, is recalled in this fashion:

"Here is an actor who sketches, father," said one of his sons, as I was led into the room he used for a studio, near Lafayette square, and though the warmth of his welcome would have been the same, I felt that the introduction meant more to him than if I had been an actor who golfed or motored or followed the conventional diversions that help to pass our idle hours.

He was very firm in his belief that an actor could give up his spare time to art or music without interfering with his means of livelihood.

"Was Seymour Haden any the less successful as an etcher because he was a famous surgeon?" he would say, "or, to go to the old masters: were Benvenuto Cellini and Leonardo di Vinci and Michael Angelo distracted by the other arts and crafts they followed? The arts go hand and hand, the knowledge of one should help the other, and I can't see that my performance of Rip Van Winkle tonight will lose through the fact that I am painting this landscape in the afternoon."

One day toward the end of the week we stole away to the Old Basin, together, armed with paint box, portfolio and sketching stools. Mr. Jefferson seldom drew architectural subjects, and the maze of outline and perspective discouraged him. He gave up finally and stood behind me.

"That's very nice, indeed," he said, "but your little darkey in the foreground is out of the picture. (When asked to pose the boy had stopped and gazed at me till the picture was blocked in.) "He should be putting oyster shells in his basket, or pulling at a rope, or doing something in harmony with the composition. A figure to be interesting must be interested, and the same rule applies to our work on the stage. Your actor who looks out at his audience with a self-conscious wink loses his grip on them at once—he should be interested only in the characters about him!"

When the day was over, we dined at Moreau's, one of the new French restaurants on the "new" side of Canal street. With its sanded floor, its choice wines and its old world atmosphere it was a favorite resort with Jefferson, who was known to every habitue in the place and was treated with the greatest consideration by the chef and the proprietor.

King of the Tillamook Development league, a meeting of that body was held at the city hall with about 30 of the most substantial business and professional men of the town in attendance, proving beyond a doubt the general interest felt in concentrated commercial organization.

The meeting was called to order by Vice-President King, W. C. Wiley acting as chairman. Mr. King stated the purpose of the meeting to be to put all league matters, from this time forth, on a strictly business basis, and conduct its affairs in a systematic manner, or else disband as an organization. Earnest interest was manifested from the outset by all present, and a warmly enthusiastic meeting was the outcome, with frank discussion of all matters pertaining to the past and present interests and also future welfare of the league.

After the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting, and their approval, Treasurer Wiley submitted the financial report showing the street fair and carnival receipts and disbursement, etc. A few additional bills were submitted for approval, and it was moved, seconded and duly carried, that the report as submitted be accepted. Inquiry was made as to status of the general fund, in addition to the fair fund. Mr. Wiley reported that a year ago \$165 was turned over to him as treasurer, of which there remains on hand, after expenditures already accounted for, an amount sufficient to meet the February salary, bill for postage, stationery, etc., of the secretary. A motion that the financial report as submitted be given to the local newspapers for publication, was duly carried.
