A BIG INDUSTRY FOR THE COUNTY

Cherry, Walnut and Asparagus Farm Comprises Two Hundred and Thirty Acres.

(Eugene Register.) Articles of Incorporation of "The Asparagus, Cherry and Walnut Company" have been filed with the county clerk of Lane county. The incorporators are A. C. Woodcock, G. A. Dorris, F. E. Dunn and C. S. Williams. The capital stock is \$50,000.

The company owns 230 acres of the best land in Lane county, about five miles from Eugene. Sixty acres have already been planted to cherries and sixty acres to walnuts. Next spring the walnut ground will be increased to 100 acres. Forty-five acres have been planted to Lambert and Ring cherries and 15 acres to Royal Annes. The walnuts are Franquette and Mayette. Most of the walnut trees were imported from France for the company by J. B. Pilkington, the nurseryman of Portland. The remainder were procured from Thomas Prince & Son, the owners of the famous Prince Grove at Dundee. About 1000 peach trees will be planted between the cherry and walnut trees.

The company has 60 acres of land which is considered ideal for the growing of asparagus. Over 200,000 plants are now being grown for the company, and next spring the entire 60 acres will be planted to asparagus. This will undoubtedly be the largest asparagus field in Oregon.

The incorporators of this company believe that they have selected the three staple products which in time will make Lane county famous. It is a conceded fact that our cherries cannot be excelled in the world.

The small groves of awlnuts and isolated trees in this vicinity seem to have demonstrated also that our soil and climate are peculiarly adapted to the growing of high grade walnuts.

Asparagus is generally considered merely an experiment, but from the results obtained by Mr. Dorris in his 25-acre asparagus field, the incorporators of the company confidently expect great results from their asparagus.

SAFE CRACKERS WORK AT PILOT ROCK STORE

A Pendleton special says: By blowing off the door to the safe in the Carnes Brothers' store at Pilot Rock, about 2 o'clock, yesterday morning, safe crackers secured more than \$100 in money and made good their escape. The officers have good descriptions of two men suspected of the crime and it is believed they will be placed under arrest before they can get out of the country.

The money taken consisted of \$40 in nickles and dimes and \$60 in silver. In addition to this robbers took a gold nugget bracelet containing 14 or 15 gold nuggets and a small gold lock, a large nugget, a meerschaum pipe with false bowl, one dozen pocket knives, and a check on the First National bank of Pendleton, drawn by L. Knotts in favor of G. W. Dones for the sum of \$31.05.

The men suspected of the crime are two strangers seen in the town the day before and regarded as the time as suspicious characters. Nothing has been seen of them since the robbery.

One of the men is described as follows: 35 or 40 years of age, 5 feet, 10 or 11 inches high and weighing about 190 pounds, dark, wearing black suit of clothes, black soft hat and a smoker of cigarettes.

The other one is described as being a man of 30 or 35 years, 5 feet, 8 inches high, weighing about 175 or 180, light brown hair, light brown mustache, light colored suit and black stiff hat. He also smoked cigarettes.

O. F. Carnes, the senior member of the firm burglarized was in Pendleton the night of the robbery and was notified by phone yesterday morning.

When the store was entered yesterday morning, two Winchester rifles were found near where the robbers were at work. Both were loaded and one was cocked, showing the men who did the work were desperate characters and prepared to go to any extremes.

Entrance to the store was effected by prying the front door open while tools stolen from a blacksmith shop were used to knock off the knob on the safe where the hole was drilled for the nitro-glycerine. The safe was completely wrecked.
