**MAYOR RODGERS UNDECIDED**

How stands the liquor question? It was thought at the conclusion of the council meeting last night that it had been finally settled at a compromise of \$700, but this may prove not to be the case. Mayor Rodgers has not by any means decided upon letting the measure go through with his approbation. It is a question if he vetoes the ordinance as it now stands, whether it will pass in spite of him. The bill passed last evening with a vote of 10 to 2, and should the matter come up for passage over the mayor's veto it is only necessary for those ten voting aye to stand firm, but will they stand firm? One alderman who voted last night in favor of the ordinance, could probably be persuaded to change his position. On the other hand, Greenbaum, who was not present last night, is in favor of the ordinance setting the license lower, and his vote would make up the one lost, thus making the ten votes required to put the bill through.

It is possible that a compromise may be effected, such as making the license \$800, and in this way secure the unanimous vote of the council.

Mayor Rodgers, in speaking of the matter this morning to a Journal reporter, stated: "I have not as yet made up my mind definitely whether I shall veto the ordinance. Of course, I have been and am now of the opinion that the license should be \$1000, and the license should be a matter of regulation of the saloon traffic, and not a question only of revenue. I will have to see what can be done before my time for signing the ordinance expires."

**GREAT POLITICAL DEBATE AT GRAND OPERA HOUSE**

**W. S. U'Ren Speaks Tonight—Challenges Any Opponent of Statement No. 1 To Meet Him and Discuss the Question—Big Salem Republican Leaders Have Been Longing To Get U'Ren Before a Home Crowd and Put Him Out of Commission**

The echoes of Saturday's convention had scarcely died away when the next political situation is sprung on this city, in the form of a joint debate between W. S. U'Ren, who has issued a challenge to any opponent of Statement No. 1 to meet him at the Grand Opera house this evening and debate the question before the large audience that will be assembled there. Several of the most prominent politicians of this city who are opposed to members of the legislature taking that pledge have been invited, and it is expected that Mr. U'Ren will have his hands full, and probably get the worst of the bargain. The Capital City debaters are a match for anything that comes from Clackamas county, and have been longing to get Mr. U'Ren before a crowd of their own people and wipe him off the face of the earth, politically speaking. At all events there will be something doing from the moment the first speaker takes the floor.

**U'Ren Appears for Cake.**  
W. S. U'Ren will speak at the Grand tonight and discuss Statement No. 1 and other things of a political nature. Mr. U'Ren is campaigning in the interests of H. M. Cake who is a candidate for nomination to the senate on the Republican ticket. It is generally understood he will take a fall out of the editor of the Oregonian, and attempt to throw some sidelights on the late county convention. That his address will be interesting and lively is pretty well understood.

**Adams Follows Instructions.**  
Many Republicans would not believe that Chairman Adams had done what The Capital Journal Monday

charged him with doing, or that Liberty delegation walked out of convention bodily when he ruled that no Statement No. 1 Republican was eligible to go to the state convention. But the following from the Salem Statesman of Tuesday morning proves all that The Journal said was true. It is well understood that Adams was acting under instructions, which all the Harriman agents in both parties have received, and that no supporter of the Roosevelt administration is to be recognized as a good Republican. But the state convention will reverse this decree, and it will be seen that the Republican party of this state is not under the thumb of the Harriman system.

**Read What a Delegate Says.**  
That the Capital Journal told the truth about Saturday's convention is proven by a letter from a delegate in the Statesman:

"In the write-up given the Republican convention of last Saturday your Sunday issue it is reported that the convention refused to instruct the delegation for W. H. Taft. We did not have been more correct to have said the chairman refused. The resolution was made and seconded in regular form, but it did not seem to suit the autocrat in the chair, so he would not put the motion. If his question had come before the convention I am satisfied it would be carried by a three to four to one vote, but the act of the chairman in keeping with his unauthorized instructions that no Statement No. 1 man was to be elected to the convention."
