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The Wisconsin Idea. This is the LaFollette gospel. Primary elections were but an incident, a means to an end. Railroad regulation is merely a remedy for one of the great evils. The abolition of the railroad pass and the telegraph, telephone and express frank was the first step in breaking the power of the railroads and other public service corporations. The passage of an anti-lobby law, forbidding paid lobbyists speaking to members of the legislature about matters of legislation, except at public hearings in committee rooms, was a second step in the same direction. The passage of a law prohibiting any employee of a public service corporation from holding a public office without first returning the passes or franks which the company gives him, was intended to help serve the same purpose.
