### ESTIMATE OF HENEY BY SACRAMENTO BEE

Considers That He is One of the Greatest Men This Age Has Produced.

Heny Strikes Back Hard at the Men Who Assail Him. (Sacramento Bee.)

Francis J. Heney, the famous prosecutor of the graft cases in San Francisco, made a remarkable address to the students of the state university last week. He denounced the Chronicle, Examiner, Oakland Tribune and the small-fry weeklies and dailies that are constantly seeking to discredit the efforts to bring rich bribers to justice. He declared that the Chronicle sold itself for \$10,000 to the Home Telephone company, and that the Examiner "would sell its soul for a filthy dollar at any time." Referring more particularly to one of these journals, he said:

"The Chronicle can turn a back somersault as quickly as any paper in the United States. And then to show that its whole time is not occupied with turning back somersault it turns a front somersault. In an editorial it denounced the decision of the court of appeals in strong terms, and then in a month when a change had come it changes after some of the shekels had reached M. H. de Young; and if he wants me to prove it, let him sue me for libel and I will prove it."

Heny declared there were three men he was determined to land in the penitentiary, and that nothing could swerve him a single inch from his purpose. These men he named as Ruef, Schmitz and Calhoun, and he said the influence of the first two for evil was trivial compared with that of Patrick Calhoun.

The prosecutor went on to speak of the purchase and subsidizing of newspapers by the criminal rich and the trusts, to color and distort news, and so mislead the public. He said on this point:

"The trusts are buying papers in California to disseminate colored news to fool you. They try to fool you in every way."

"There is a shorthand reporter sitting here tonight taking down my speech for them."

They're overlooking no weapon in the hasty attempt to break down the laws. The money of San Francisco is behind it. The money of the Southern Pacific is behind it. Pat Calhoun's money is behind it, that of the telephone with Frank Drum, the gas company with Martin and De Sabla is behind it. Will Crocker, of the Crocker-Woolworth National bank, is behind it because of his connection with Brobeck, the Wells Fargo-Nevada National bank with Hellman is behind it, the Bank of California with King and Anderson is behind it."

Heny ridiculed the pretense that the corporations had been "held up" by Ruef, showing that Ruef was carried on the payrolls of a number of
