## FIGURES ON EDUCATION

### A Linn County Granger Discusses Liberality of Other States.

Editor Journal:

Seeing a published account of the trip taken by State Superintendent Ackerman and the many states and colleges visited and where he is reported as saying some thing that seems uncalled for. He says every state I visited is giving more money per capita for the support of its state institutions of learning than Oregon. Now Oregon is accredited with a population of 500,000 and when they put up nearly \$500,000 for higher education it would look as though they are not stingy, in fact it would seem quite liberal taking into consideration her wealth and population on this basis of population New York having a population of 8,000,000 should appropriate \$8,000,000 for higher education; Pennsylvania some 7,000,000; Georgia, \$2,500,000; Texas about the same as 2,500,000; Texas about the same as Illinois about 5,500,000; Minnesota, 4,500,000; Missouri, 3,500,000 Nebraska, Kansas and California say \$1,500,000 each. There must be some mistake somewhere. Is it the commissioner of education or is it Mr. Ackerman? Again he is credited as saying the eastern educators were taking great interest in the referendum and were watching its practical workings in this state. Some expressed the fear that the electorate would not be as liberal in educational matters as the state legislature has been. Mr. Ackerman assured these people that he believed the people would always uphold the legislature in the matter of appropriation for education. If correctly quoted this is a pretty state of affairs where the people would always people reserved the right to legislate it was for this and the like that the people reserved the rights to legislate for themselves and to undo the doings of legislative action. Mr. Ackerman is again mistaken in the demands of the people who felt that there is some other demands upon the people's money beside the state university. This way of doing will drive the average citizen to exclaim with the Oregonian of Feb. 11, 1905, where it says people are going crazy on public education and the educational machine taking advantage of this catalyst on intellect or prostration of judgment rides the dumb beast under whip and spur. If a machine then what is it now? It per-

meates the very air. We see it in the Teacher's Monthly; in the state press; in every leaflet and its inspired articles is seen word for word in neighboring state publications. Really to quote the poet "If you touch one string they all will ring." The school machine, "chief of machines," as the Oregonian says, once more must have it. It is their bread, their meat, their butter, common schools can get along on \$8 per student, its patrons can build their own school houses, tax themselves to pay the teacher. Oh yes, but the U. of O. must have \$125,000 continually without specifications."

## STANFORD UNIVERSITY RESENTS GAG LAW.

Stanford University, Cal., March 19.—Following the action of the Students' Affairs Committee this afternoon, in voting to hear separately the story of each one of the 300 students who admitted they participated in Thursday's demonstration in front of Prof. Clark's home, a rumor was circulated on the campus that the San Francisco alumni of the college has prepared a petition asking for the removal of President Jordan, of Stanford.

The report created a big stir, but all efforts to confirm it were fruitless. At 2 o'clock this afternoon the Students' Affairs Committee, of which Prof. Clark is the head, reported its decision on the petition signed by 300 students, who openly admitted that they were in the demonstration.

The committee refused to believe that all of them participated, and decided to settle the matter by giving each one a private hearing. It is predicted that, if each one adheres to his story, they will all be dismissed. The first of the private hearings began this afternoon.

Leo Stanley, a student in the physiology department of the university was expelled from that branch today, because of the manner in which he expressed his views concerning the demonstration, which has caused so much ill-feeling. It is reported that Stanley said he would have participated in it himself if he had not been engaged in entertaining Dr. Blue, the federal inspector, that night.

As the result of the action taken against him, the students have raised the war cry "freedom of speech."

## SOME SUGGESTIONS FOR SPECTACULAR LIGHTING

"If a colored lamp bulb be placed in such a reflector, on looking straight into the reflector the surface will appear colored. If the lamp bulb the colored in bands running either longitudinally or horizontally, these colors will be taken up by the reflector and blended into one another. By choosing a reflector of a flower-like shape, the effect of luminous blossoms having every conceivable tint or combination of tints may be produced. For example, the bulb may be given a yellow tint near the base, a band of red tint around the center and green over the end. When the lamp is placed in the reflector the surface will be yellow in the deepest portion, blending into red, and that into green about the open end, while the green end of the lamp-bulb will represent the center of the flower. Or, the bands of color may be run lengthwise, which will give the effect of a flower having petals of different colors. Beautiful effects are obtained by dipping the end of the lamp in a 'frosting solution' and then coloring the other portion, giving the effect of a flower with a white center. These are only indications of the method to be pursued; the possible variations are endless, and are worth experimenting with simply for one's diversion. . . .

"By a similar method very beautiful results may be secured by the use of large holophane globes having colored lamps hung within, and connected with a flasher by which the different colors can be lighted up.

The globe entirely hides the light source, showing only the color of the light within. Thus, the globe may be made to change its color entirely, or, what is more effective, it may be made to take different variations. Thus, suppose red, green, yellow and blue lamps are hung within it; if the blue and yellow lamps be lighted some of the facets of the prisms will show green while others will show yellow. The effect will be indescribable, and not only beautiful but mysterious, which is always a powerful element of interest. The red and green make a similar combination that is beautiful.

"The use of the mercury-vapor lamp, with its distinct peacock blue color, has been taken very little advantage of in spectacular lighting. It furnishes a most striking contrast when used with the yellow light of incandescent lamps, and could be used very advantageously in many cases to break the monotony of the too familiar lamp."—Illuminating Engineer.
