Class 12—To be shown in harness, to wagon or truck. This class includes horses used for drawing large loads at the walk, weighing not less than 1500 pounds in fair flesh. In brief, the draft horse should have a stout, compact body on short, strong legs, with a head and neck in proportion to size of the horse. The general appearance should be massive and give evidence of spirit without nervousness.

**Best draft team, pair to weight not less than 3000, \$10.**

**Wade, Pearce & Co., Special Premium**—For best draft team, pair to weight not less than 2800 pounds, carving set, value \$7.50.

**Farmer's Draft Team (3 Horses).**

Class 13—To be shown in harness ready for hitch, average weight not less than 1400 pounds.

**Best farmer's draft team, \$10.**

**Four-in-Hand Team.**

Class 14—To be shown in harness hitched to coach or wagon. Best four-in-hand team (geldings or mares), \$10.

**Roadsters—Harness Horses.**

Class 15—Standard or non-standard. The typical roadster stands from 15 to 15.3 hands high and weighs 900 to 1150 pounds; head fine and clean-cut, with an erect, neat, medium-sized ear, a full, clear eye, and open, good-sized nostrils. The conformation and action in a roadster that enables him with ease to draw a light vehicle on the road at a fairly high rate of speed, for a considerable distance, are desired.

**Spencer Hardware Co. Special Premium**—Best mare or gelding exhibited by lady (to be shown to vehicle, equipment considered), set silver knives and forks, value \$5.

**H. D. Patton Special Premium**—For best mare or gelding (to be shown to vehicle), silver cup, value \$6.

**Steusloff Bros. Special Premium**—For best pair mares or geldings (to be shown to vehicle), silver cup, value \$10.

**Saddlers.**

Class 16—The saddle horse should have a spirited, stylish appearance, with high carried head and smartly set tail. Should weigh from 1000 to 1200 pounds.

**Geo. W. Johnson & Co. Special Premium**—Best mare or gelding, suit case, value \$8.

"After the legislature of Idaho had changed the law in important particulars to aid in the prosecution of Haywood and Pettibone, and appropriated over \$100,000 for the purposes; after the combined efforts of the sleuths of two detective agencies; after President Roosevelt, his man Taft, the governors of two states and practically all the capitalist press of the country, had done what they could to prejudice the case in favor of the prosecution; and after two juries in his own count had repudiated the frame-work of the prosecution, and declared these men not guilty, now comes the trial judge, sniveling in class prejudice, declaring a failure of justice, and proclaiming the guilt of the accused. In his readiness to accept the unsupported word of a degenerate like Harry Orchard against a score of reputable witnesses, and to presume guilt without lawful evidence, where the law presumes innocence until guilt is proved, Judge Wood shows the true spirit of capitalism."

"Resolved, That this whole case from start to finish shows the reign of the class instinct, and that it is utter folly for the working class to expect justice and fair treatment from the master class; that it is criminal stupidity for the workers to elect the masters to make and administer the laws."
