FOREST GROVE MAN ACCUSED

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Portland, Or., April 1.—Charged with causing the death of Miss Mabel Wirtz, the daughter of Justice of Peace Henry Wirtz of Forest Grove, Or., by mercurial poisoning, Dr. J. B. Whitney of Forest Grove, Or., is in jail. The coroner and district attorney are now perfecting the evidence they have against him.

Whitney has admitted, it is said, having given the girl the poison solution for her use, and will probably tell his story voluntarily to the coroner, as he says the girl's death was accidental. The charge against Dr. Whitney fell like a thunder bolt in the circle of the Wirtz family and the friends of the young dentist. It was only brought to light yesterday when the funeral of the dead girl, which was stopped in a sensational manner by the undertaker, when after a long delay, he received the death certificate from the attending physician. The certificate gave the cause of death as "mercurial poisoning."

The coroner was at once notified and took charge. He allowed the funeral services to proceed but refused to permit the body to be moved until the case had been fully investigated. Following this declaration came the statement from Whitney that he had given Miss Wirtz a solution several weeks ago to use. He did not know at that time, he said, that contained poison in sufficient quantity to result fatally. The dentist was arrested and taken to jail.

Whitney comes from Grand Rapids, Mich., and is a graduate of a Chicago dental college. He has been practicing in Oregon for three years.

Mrs. Wirtz was 21 years of age.

THE BENSON HYDE LAND FRAUD CASE

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Washington, April 1.—A case given considerable publicity, Joost H. Schneider would state's evidence, was emphasized when the celebrated Benson Hyde land fraud case was called today in the criminal branch of United States supreme court before Justice Stafford.

Many of the 200 witnesses heard in the case were on hand day but little was accomplished other than the preliminaries of opening of the case.

There have been numerous postponements preventing the case from reaching the supreme court. Only recently congress appropriated \$60,000 to meet the expenses of prosecution.
