"The \$20,000,000 bond issue for the deep waterway through Illinois will not be defeated," Congressman William Lorimer stated at the conclusion of his campaign throughout the state for the waterway.





1 .- Increase of the salary of the members of the legislature.

2 .- To locating state institutions outside of capital.

3 .- To increase supreme judges from three to five.


