### World Supremacy.

With regard to the great nations of the white race, it is, of course, the Japanese statesmen that are the one great nation that are at the realization of their ambitions. Of course, we accept Japan's protestations of friendship and we should most cordially reciprocate friendly feelings should realize that if any breach of good will comes between the two countries it would be our fault, on account of being so defenseless, and the fault of Japan.

America cannot ignore the fact that the most trifling incidents that occur in San Francisco were taken upon by Japan and made great international affairs; nor can we ignore the fact that where Japanese were involved in a simple matter of education the Japanese government made a demand upon the government that involved the interests of the local self-government of the people of San Francisco and that our government by acceding to such a demand before regular negotiations could be resumed.

The proper investigation of the situation of national defense involves consideration of the possibility of war with Great Britain and Japan combined, these two nations being a war in which our flag would be wiped from the sea and in the hands of India and China as well as Japan could be thrown upon our shores.

As we are still living at the period when nations have to have navies as long as nations have to have armies, America, the peace nation, must have the greatest navy.

## MINISTER WAS PUBLICLY WHIPPED

Turlock, Cal., April 2.—The Rev. J. M. Hibish, pastor of the Methodist church of this village, is today swathed in bandages and under the care of a physician as the result of a public thrashing administered to him last night by three women, who lashed him with horsewhips until he fell to the sidewalk unconscious. Jennie Keenrey, Ethel Jost and Jessie Halley, were angry at the minister because, they said, he made remarks derogatory to their reputations. They stood in the door of a restaurant, where they are employed as waitresses, when the Rev. Hibish passed. In the folds of their dresses horsewhips were concealed. When the minister stopped to converse with a friend the women rushed to the sidewalk and lashed him furiously in view of pedestrians. He fell unconscious with his face and hands cut by the whip. While he was trying to dodge the blows a man, evidently a friend of the three women, slugged Hibish and escaped. The waitresses say they do not regret their act.

## AFTER ROCKEY'S OFFSPRING

Chicago, April 2.—Mrs. Harold McCormick, daughter of John D. Rockefeller, today is verging on a nervous breakdown, and is preparing to depart hastily from the city, as the result of a series of threatening letters received by her from anarchists who have led her to believe that her life and those of her children are in peril.

Guards have been placed about the mansion at Bellevue Place and Lake Shore drive and no stranger is permitted to enter the grounds. As soon as possible Mrs. McCormick will leave for her father's home in Cleveland.

Fear is felt for the safety of Mrs. McCormick's children, who are with John D. Rockefeller in the south. The contents of a threatening letter received today have been kept secret by the members of her household. Mrs. McCormick, who is of a highly nervous disposition, has been badly frightened for weeks over the first letters, but today the collapse was almost complete.

Two months ago Mrs. Potter Palmer received a similar warning and since then many of the foremost homes in the fashionable quarter have maintained a watch for suspicious characters.

## PROBING INDIAN AFFAIRS

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Washington, April 2.—Accusing Secretary Garfield of being guilty of malfeasance in office and lying, Mrs. Helen Pierce Gray, a newspaper woman, stirred the members of the senate committee on Indian affairs by making this and other charges against the government service on the Crow Indian reservation in Montana.

Mrs. Grey, who paid a visit to the reservation last summer, made the charges against Garfield when she was called before the committee to substantiate statements she had made concerning conditions on the reservation. Among other things she said money belonging to the Indians was wasted and that some of it disappeared as the result of grafting methods in the management of the affairs.

Then she broke down and related her experience in jail, where she was placed by Major Reynolds on a charge of illegally securing money from Indians. Commissioner of Indian Affairs Leupp denied a charge that he was interested in a project for a town site on the reservation.

## WEALTH HELPING POVERTY

Boston, April 2.—A sociological undertaking which is to exceed anything of the kind ever attempted in New England, if not in America, is being planned by Prof. Charles Zueblin, who recently resigned his professorship of sociology at the University of Chicago, and Mrs. Quincy Adams Shaw, the famous philanthropist and wife of the richest citizen in Boston.

Both of these people have associated themselves in the work of social uplifting. This work will take the form of establishing self supporting settlements in Boston and throughout Massachusetts, and already for this purpose \$2,000,000 has been set aside by Mrs. Shaw, which amount is later to be increased to \$5,000,000.
