GENERAL FIRMIN'S FRIENDS

Continual Execution of Enemies of the Government of Hayti Without Trial.

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Port au Prince, April 3.—White residents here are clamoring for the landing of marines from the foreign warships in the harbor. American, German and French business men insist that the conditions are graver than have been appreciated by the representatives of foreign governments here. They say that the blacks are daily becoming more bold and more insulting and that a general massacre will certainly result unless there is a foreign demonstration.

Executions by government troops without the formality of a trial continue despite the government's promise to M. Carteron, the French consul, that they would cease. Today the body of Arsene Chevry, a poet and writer, was found hanging to a tree riddled with bullets. The man, who was known throughout the island as a dreamer and idealist, was suspected of being friendly to the cause of General Firmin, the revolutionist.

Today the white laborers employed by the American export companies congregated at Gonalves, where they have barricaded a warehouse. They are all armed and say that if trouble breaks out they will do some fighting on their own accord to protect American property.

KLAMATH RIVER POWER

Larger Plant to Be Developed Near the City in the South.

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Klamath Falls, April 3.—Definite announcement has been made here that the Southern Pacific intends to build one of the greatest power plants in their system on the Klamath river rapids near here. The power obtained will be used to drive the Southern Pacific trains through the mountains.

When E. H. Harriman visited Klamath Falls last summer it is said he was greatly impressed with the possibilities of a power plant at this point and made frequent personal examinations.

In any event the Southern Pacific engineers have been working here all winter and are now ready to begin actual operations.

The fall at the proposed site of the plant is over 100 feet to the mile and the rapids present a decline at this rate for a distance of over five miles. This will give the plant a fall of 500 feet and will assure tremendous power.

MINER REMEMBERS CONGRESS WILL WOMAN HE LOVED WORK UNTIL TIME

Yukon, R. C., April 3.—Either through an accident or design William H. H. telegraph operator of the Dominion Yukon Telegraph company, who had charge of a small office in the far north, 38 miles from the nearest neighbor, died from an overdose of morphine and as a result of his death, the news of which had just reached this city, the secret of a romance that stretched from within a few miles of the Arctic circle to sunny Los Angeles, has been discovered.

Among the papers that were found in the little cabin, deserted but for the stiffened corpse, was Heinz' will. In the will was a codicil, which must have been addressed but a short time before his death, leaving his entire property to Flora Franklin, a young girl now living in a Los Angeles convent. Heinz was 50 years of age. Months ago he became acquainted with Flora Franklin, whom he met in Vancouver. He sent her to be educated and it was said they were engaged. She was not allowed to have parents and Heinz acted as both a father and lover. To follow operators Heinz said he would kill himself if she ever gave him up.

Then his orders came, and obedient to them, he plunged deep into the wilds of the north, his only link with the outside world being the copper wire which stretched southward hundreds of miles to Vancouver.

It is thought that his absence from the woman he loved so preyed upon his mind that he went insane. The estate amounts to over \$2000.
