LET THERE BE NO CONFUSING THE ISSUES

The fight to enforce Statement No. 1 in the election of an United States senator is not a fight on the Republican party.

It is a fight for a clean principle that is to DRIVE CORRUPTION OUT OF THIS PARTICULAR BRANCH OF POLITICS.

It has become the most lucrative phase of practical politics, going to the legislature and electing senators.

Men of no particular ability as law makers, who stand for no new principles of legislation or reform, run for the legislature.

They do so and are encouraged to do so because THEY KNOW THEY CAN GET PAY FOR THEIR VOTES FOR SENATOR, OR OFFICIAL REWARD.

That business has been knocked in the head by the direct primary law and the industry will be killed if the people enforce the law.

The way to enforce the law is to demand that all who want to go to the legislature take Statement No. 1, AND QUIT SELLING THEIR VOTES.

It is just as bad to sell your vote for a clerkship, or for an appropriation or for a federal office as for cash.

We know some very good men who have done it and under the system of electing senators IN THE PAST IT HAS BEEN PART OF THE POLITICAL GAME.

The Republicans who stand for Statement No. 1 honestly believe the direct primary law should be obeyed in the letter and spirit.

They believe that sound Republicanism means clean Republicanism and progressive Republicanism AND IS IN THE INTEREST OF THE FAITHY.

Republicans have as much right under the direct primary law to stand for Statement No. 1 as members of any party and be true Republicans.

The voters of Marion county at the primary should make a square decision on Statement No. 1.

There are five men running for representatives WHO ARE UNQUALIFIED FOR STATEMENT NO. 1.

There are five running for representative who are unqualifiedly against Statement No. 1.

By some ruling of the officials there will be no distinctive statement allowed on the ballot TO SHOW WHICH IS WHICH.

This is wrong, and will tend to confusion. It is recalled that two years ago candidates worked people on both sides.

That is the trick of the politician TO GET VOTES FROM THOSE WHO ARE REALLY OPPOSED TO HIM IN PRINCIPLE.

In the present campaign there

should be a drawing of lines, and let the people say which set of men they prefer.

If they want Statement No. 1 men let them say so. IF THEY WANT TO PUT THE SENATORSHIP UP AT A RAFFLE LET THEM SAY SO.

It is people elect the senator or barrel elect. Take your choice.

If the people say barrel by voting down the people's choice candidates, barrel goes, and let us expect nothing different.

If the people want their little indelible pencil mark to decide the senatorship, LET THEM SAY SO BY VOTING FOR STATEMENT NO. 1 MEN.

If they want to restore the ancient and dishonorable system of graft in connection with electing United States senators, vote down Statement No. 1.

There is no choice. There is no middle ground. YOU EITHER FAVOR ELECTING SENATORS BY DIRECT VOTE OF THE PEOPLE OR YOU DO NOT.

Do not complain if you support the barrel method if the members of the general assembly take you at your word and make merchandise of it.

HIGH SCHOOL GROUNDS

WERE BEAUTIFIED

The Salem high school student and faculty have caught the boost spirit. Friday afternoon school was dismissed and the students started a campaign of improvements in the shape of planting trees and beautifying the lawn. Plans and specifications had already been drawn up and the ground staked off and it was but a short time before the work was completed. The students were divided up into gangs under one of the faculty as a boss and a mag's change was soon effected in the formerly barren high school grounds. On different parts of the grounds silver birch, larch, cedar, pine and lilac trees were planted. On either side of the walk leading to the main entrance and lying parallel to the building a bed of hydrangias was set out, while long beds of natural Oregon ferns were planted along the cement in the shade of the building, which will probably prove an ideal place for their growth. Two more beds of flowers, one on either corner of the lot are planned to be set out later.

This is a credible effort on the part of the faculty and students as it is going to add greatly to the appearance of Salem's finest school building.
