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AN APOLOGY TO THE PEOPLE.

The Capital Journal wishes to apologize to the people for not having facilities to print a larger paper.

We are printing now more pages each week than ever before.

During the past week pages of advertising have been crowded out for want of space in our little paper.

It never had as good a circulation as at present or enjoyed as much business of a first-class, legitimate character.

We have just received the largest carload of flat paper ever shipped to Salem.

Mr. Joseph Meyers made The Capital Journal a proposition to build it a fine office building on Court street.

We would have taken him up but for the fact that last year it was proposed to pave Commercial street.

Mrs. Sampson Jones, who has been our landlady for many years said she felt too poor to pay for the paving.

The Journal was advocating paving and we offered if she would not remonstrate against paving to pay for the pavement.

So we will not move into new quarters or get a new press until the street is paved, and we have kept our agreement with Widow Jones.

In the meantime we are prepared to print as large a paper as our patrons call for.

A FEW WORDS WITH OUR FRIENDS OF THE MACHINE.

Our esteemed friends of the Oregon Republican machine are taking offense because this paper is not whooping it up for their program.

Whatever that program is, it is not a program for the abolition of any abuses or FOR POPULARIZING THE REPUBLICAN PARTY WITH THE PEOPLE.

We publish in this paper the decree of Judge Galloway in the Dunbar case, where a verdict is found for over \$100,000 due the state.

The machine politicians fought the flat salary reform at every step. The editor of this paper went to the state conventions in 1902, when they say he was fighting the Republican party, and GOT BOTH PARTIES TO PUT A FLAT SALARY PLANK IN THEIR PLATFORMS.

The Oregonian and the machine leaders advised Mr. Furnish, the machine nominee for governor, to spit on the flat salary plans.

Mr. George Chamberlain advocated the flat salary law and was elected.

A bill was introduced in the legislature to put Mr. Dunbar, elected to a second term as secretary of state, on the flat salary WHICH HE PROMISED THE PEOPLE HE WOULD ACCEPT, by taking a nomination on a flat salary platform.

Mr. Dunbar and the rest of the

machine politicians defeated that flat salary law in the senate after it had passed the house almost unanimously.

In the next legislature the flat salary law was again fought by the machine and the date of its going into effect WAS DEFERRED TWO YEARS BEFORE THE BILL WAS ALLOWED TO GO INTO EFFECT.

The machine robbed the people of this state of over \$100,000 on that one office by violating the Republican platform, which had promised the people a flat salary law.

But what is a bagatelle of \$100,000 for four years FOR ONE STATE OFFICE TO THE MACHINE POLITICIANS OF OREGON?

At present the machine at Salem is hiring columns of space in the Statesman to show the people what bad Republicans Bourne, U'Ren and Hofer, of The Capital Journal, are.

But they should spend some time overhauling their own bad works and learning to do better.

WHEN THEY HAVE DONE RIGHT AND WORKED WITH THE PEOPLE THEY HAVE WON.

The Republican machine in Oregon has done some very unsatisfactory work and the managers, instead of getting wise and taking hold of matters along progressive lines in which the people are interested,

they abuse men who try to bring the party nearer to the people.

WHEN THEY ABUSE A MAN FOR STANDING BY THE PEOPLE THEY ALWAYS LOSE.

We ask our friends of the machine to read the Galloway decision and then reflect on what better terms they would be with the people of this state if they had stood up for a flat salary law and had obeyed the constitution of this state as men like General Odell advised them to.

They would have avoided the election of a Democratic governor, would have saved the people \$100,000 in four years, and would have abolished an ancient graft that was too rank for any man of intelligence in any party to stand up for, and which 10,000 Republicans repudiated.

WHO ARE THE LOYAL REPUBLICANS?

In a hired space in the Statesman some unknown and anonymous oracle of the machine tries to put the Statement No. 1 Republicans in the attitude of threatening to bolt the Republican ticket if Statement No. 1 men are not put up for the legislature.

There is no proof that Statement No. 1 Republicans ARE NOT AT LEAST AS LOYAL TO THE PARTY AS THE OPONENTS OF STATEMENT NO. 1.

Two years ago Statement No. 1 men supported the whole Republican ticket, while the anti knifed men like Simmons, and nearly all the leaders boast that they voted for John M. Gearin for senator.

Three of the anti's who were in the legislature from Marion county REFUSED TO VOTE FOR THE CHOICE OF THE PEOPLE ALTHOUGH THAT CHOICE WAS A REPUBLICAN.

In the late county convention Chairman Adams threw out the remark that no Statement No. 1 Republican should be selected to go to the state convention, and the Liberty delegates walked out.

The convention itself was called after several secret conferences of the machine managers for the express purpose TO PREVENT ANY STATEMENT NO. 1 REPUBLICAN from going to the legislature from Marion county.

Was that using the Republican machinery of this county fairly in the interests of harmony?

Was it fair treatment of the Statement No. 1 men for two of the stated

orators of that convention to roast the Statement No. 1 men?

The Statement No. 1 men support a fundamental Republican principle on which the battles of the civil war were fought.

They will be found supporting Republican principles in future as in the past, but Republicanism for the people and not for the system.

WHO ARE THEY?

Who is O. L. Hatterberg of Silverton? He is a successful farmer and banker. He has made his own living by labor. HE STARTED AS A CARPENTER. He is a Statement No. 1 man.

Who is A. C. Libbey of Jefferson? He is a prosperous young farmer. He has been road supervisor. The Libbey boys are several, all honest, clean young American farm boys. A. C. LIBBEY IS A GRANGER, and Deputy Grand Master of the Odd Fellows. He is a Statement No. 1 man.

Who is Henry J. Miller of Aurora? He is a hop buyer, raised in this county of good, substantial German parents, a life long Republican, a clean honorable young man, and HIS ONLY CRIME IS THAT HE MADE HIMSELF A CANDIDATE ON STATEMENT NO. 1.

Who is Hal D. Patton? A Salem bookseller and friend of the school children. He has given away flags to the school to teach the rising generation lessons of patriotism, while those who are attacking him for it WANT TO DEBAUCH THE RISING GENERATION by returning to the purchase and sale system of making United States senators.

Who is Walter C. Winslow? A law student and graduate of the state university. A young man who in debating and athletics has won an ENVIABLE REPUTATION FOR ABILITY AND FAIRNESS. His only offense is that he is a Statement No. 1 man.

These five men are all candidates on their merits and are not asking for personal honors or emoluments. They seek to go to the legislature UPON THE PRINCIPLE FOR WHICH THEY STAND.

They became candidates on their own account and are not under the thumb or control of any man or set of men, and will owe allegiance to no boss or machine, but will be responsible to the people direct.

They will not go to the legislature to overthrow any law the people have enacted in the interest of good government.
