

AVALANCHE IN TACOMA Tacoma, Wash., April 8.-With scratched tickets by independent is voters running into the thousands, the Republican still marshalled their party adherents in sol'd array yesterday nd won the most sweeping victory ever known in the history of the city. Not a Democrat on the ticket even came close to election.

Mayor Wright went down under an avalanche of Republican votes, the common the worst defeated candidate for mayor who ever ran, linking 2041 over him. Every Republican councilman was e'ected by pluralities rainging from 732 down to 85. The work of the independent voters seemed to figure, however to a growing extent. 
