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NO PARTY DIVISION.

Of Republican Votes Among Several Candidates in June Under Primary Law—Those Who So Believe Are Misinformed—Letter from West Known Benton County Man.

(In the letter below, Mr. George R. Hall, of Bellfountain, explains that in the June election there will be but one Republican candidate for senator. The only time there will be more than one Republican candidate is at the primaries on the 19th of April.

Ed Journal: With your permission I will endeavor to correct an error that is believed by me to exist in the minds of several Republicans here about having reference to the Primary law and Statement No. 1. The error referred to is that Republicans by dividing their vote among several candidates while the Democrats may concentrate their vote upon one, may be able to elect that one by a plurality vote.

Where has there been any advantage? Now comes the ticket that elects. The Republican can vote for his man for each office and so can the Democrat for his, but let me here state that the candidates for U. S. senator are the big ones, and each party has one and may take its choice individually, and collectively.

Under the Primary plan, as by the old regime of the convention plan. But what, say you, has all this to do with Statement No. 1. It is just this. The people's choice for U. S. senator must be ratified by their legislature. The representatives and senators whom they elect to represent those in their legislature

and whom should be instructed by their constituents to vote for the people's choice, made by them at the preceding election. And the servant who will not obey his master by doing his bidding by subscribing to Statement No. 1, has no right to our votes, and we have a right to entertain a suspicion. That a candidate refusing to comply with our wishes as ascertained by our voters, wishes to sell his own vote to the highest bidder and thus assist in filling his pockets with tainted money and the U. S. senate with corporation tools.

Stock Without Water. W. E. Russell, of Sheridan, in a letter to the Railroad Commission complains that during 54 hours he was on the road with a carload of cattle from Milton to Sheridan, the animals were not furnished with any water other than what he was compelled to furnish them from a hand bucket, and that during the 24 hours on the run from Portland to Sheridan not a drop of water was furnished them. The first part of the run was on the line of the Oregon Railway and Navigation Company, and from Portland to Milton was on the line of the Southern Pacific company. The matter will be investigated by the Commission.

MACHINE METHODS UNMASKED

Ex-Democratic Boss at the Head of the Machine in Marion County to Down the Direct Primary Law

The Statesman will not say who writes or pays for the anonymous two-column space devoted to the editor of The Capital Journal in every issue.

According to its regular rates that space must cost some one at least \$500, AND SOME ONE MUST PUT UP THE MONEY. WHO IS IT?

There is little doubt in the minds of the public that the money is raised and the space hired by the Salem machine politicians.

At the head of these is an ex-Democrat who but a few years ago was a deputy sheriff under Frank Durbin, AND WHO POSES AS THE FULTON MANAGER IN THIS CITY.

Two years ago he ruined the political chances of Alex La Follette, and made a life and death fight to keep Tom Kay out of the senate.

In the eyes of the machine all are Populists who this year sign Statement No. 1. This would include the best men running in Multnomah county, and all the Republican candidates in many of the counties of the state.

In following the lead of THIS EX-DEMOCRATIC OFFICE HOLDER FROM IOWA, who first held office under the Democrats and NOW ASSUMES TO RUN THE REPUBLICAN PARTY OF MARION COUNTY, the Republicans of Marion county are liable to find themselves out of the organization of both houses.

Sunday's Oregonian published a table showing that in the lower house 53 CANDIDATES HAD TAKEN STATEMENT NO. 1, AND 41 THE PARTY CHOICE STATEMENT, while in the senate 13 sign Statement No. 1, and 15 take the party choice. It is a well known fact that most of the holdover senators are Statement No. 1 men.

Under this ex-Democrat's mistaken leadership, the party will not only be split, but it will be absolutely impossible should he succeed in naming his legislative slate to secure the organization of either house or senate, AND ALL MARION COUNTY INTERESTS WILL BE IMPERILED.

Do Marion county Republicans want such a machine to rule them? Prominent Louisiana Woman Gone.

In the death of Mrs. Caroline E. Merrick, of New Orleans, Louisiana, loses one of her foremost citizens, and the cause of woman suffrage throughout the country loses one of its ablest advocates and most consistent supporters. Mrs. Merrick was a close friend of Susan B. Anthony in the days when the woman suffrage question counted comparatively few adherents in the south. At the national convention of suffragists held in New Orleans in 1902, Mrs. Merrick shared with Miss Anthony all the honors.

Mrs. Merrick was a figure of interest at the National Woman Suffrage convention in Baltimore in 1906, and it was during this meeting that Miss Anthony was stricken with the illness which ended in her death a month later.
