BENTON COUNTY WON.

First Prizes at Salem Horse Show—Whitaker Colt Beat Them All—So Did Richard Kiger's Dick K—Many Exhibitors Coming to Corvallis Livestock Show.

Benton county won two first prizes at the Salem horse show on Saturday, and what makes the case interesting is that the two prize winning entries were the only ones made. The prize winners were a ten-months-old Percheron colt, owned by Peter Whitaker, mentioned of which was made in a recent issue of the Times, and a driving horse, entered and driven by Richard Kiger. The horse is a black gelding, and is well known in Benton county as Dick K, having won a similar prize in the Corvallis horse show last year. The Whitaker colt was entered in the colt class under a year old. He had to go against a large number of entries, and the fact that he took first prize over all is a matter of considerable local pride.

A number of the members of the committee on arrangements attended the show, and got in touch with breeders from various parts of the state with a view of increasing the entries at the Benton county livestock show to be held in Corvallis May 15th and 16th. Mr. Flaherty, of Plainview, who has one of the best Herodford herds in the state is expected to be among the exhibitors. Another interesting exhibit likely to result from the visit is the large exhibit of Duroc Jersey pigs, to be entered by Mr. Jones of Mission Bottom. These hogs, as all farmers know, are red in color, and are becoming very popular among breeders of the state. Mr. Jones has imported a large number of fancy females and males of the breed from Kansas, and they and their offspring will be among the exhibits.

Still another interesting exhibit will be a herd of Guernsey from the famous Dave Looney herd at Jefferson, Marion county. The Guernsey is becoming widely popular among dairymen on account of its larger size, and the exhibit will be of great interest to local dairymen.

The committee has made arrangements for complete tent accommodations for all stock, and for a huge tent to be used for the judging events. The main tent to be used will be 24x180 feet. The main tent will be 65x130, and will be provided all around with circus seats, so that the spectators will have a complete view of every animal while in the process of scoring and be able to view everything in complete comfort. The judging ring will be so surrounded by a woven wire fence that the crowd cannot surge forward and interfere with the view of the onlookers.
