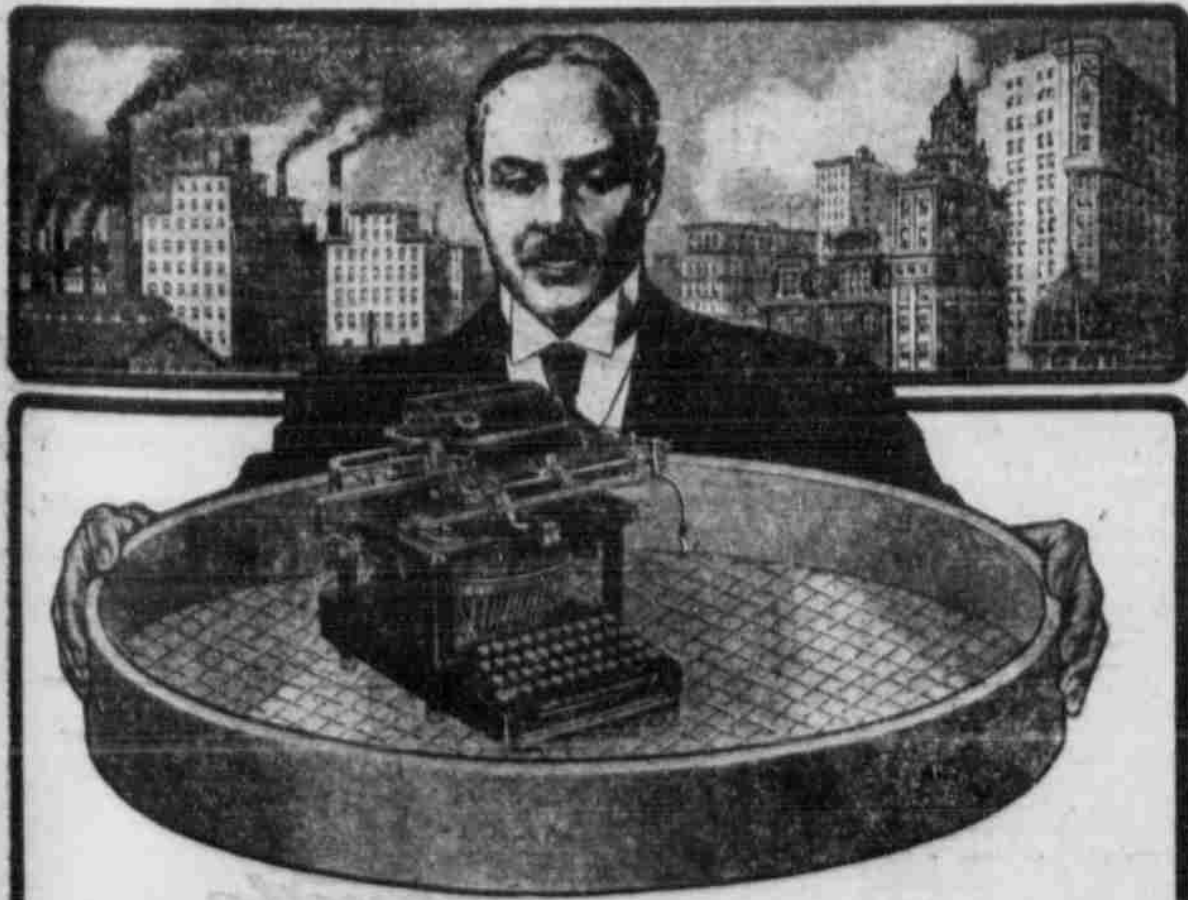

LOCAL BASEBALL BY JOCK

The Tri-City leaguers of this city have signed up Ira Hamilton, a local boy, for the outfield. Although Hamilton has not aspired for any high positions for a number of years, he is capable of handling out the real article when it comes to maneuvering on a ball field.

Broughton, the youngster who entered the box for four innings in last Sunday's game between Fairmount and the Cherry Pickers, will be retained in the Salem Tri-City aggregation. Broughton is undoubtedly a ball player, but what class in which he should be considered is somewhat doubtful.

By Sunday next the big grandstand at the Asylum Avenue baseball park will be completed and in readiness for the Fairmount vs. Jefferson game. A clean, roomy grandstand, is considered about half the game to the lady fans.

But Lucas and Hull will do the shooting for the Salem Tri-City leaguers next Sunday and Saturday in the first official game of the season between Salem and Woodburn. The most important games of the season are the first and the last; the winner of the first game obtaining the percentage foothold, and the winner of the last game the pennant.

Saturday afternoon the Tri-City League will open the baseball season of 1908 with a game between the West Portland Frakes and Hal Pomeroy's East Side Triple T nine at the Vaughn street grounds. The Commuters will send out Harry Gardner, a youth with good speed, to mow down the Milliners, while Nick Whitehead will depend on Brackie, last year the star mound artist of the Astoria team. Gardner is the lad who let out Ed. Davies' Athenians with seven hits last year with the Trunkmakers. Salem and Woodburn will play the opening game at Woodburn next Saturday and Sunday.

The West Side bunch is an unknown quantity, as Manager Whitehead has been having considerable trouble with refractory players. Among the boys who will be out Saturday in the Milliners' uniform are Kirby Drennan, who played center field for Portland's Pacific Coast League team in 1904 and later played with the Northwest League; Joe Fay, who was the mainstay of Whitehead's team last year, and Archie and Rich Parrott, the "baseball brothers," who will hold down first base and left garden respectively. McElwain, Johnson and Antoine will also be out in the Milliners' uniform.

For the East Side, Ray Kennedy, the star first sacker of the Tri-City League last season, will be at his old position. John Tauscher, one of the star outfielders of last season, and Troy Meyers will be at short. The game will be called promptly at 3:30 p. m. Sunday afternoon, the same teams will play at the grounds, the game being called at 2:30.

Notice to Improve a Portion of Broadway Street.

copied by the said Oregon Electric regular meeting of the common council held April 6, 1908, a resolution was adopted to improve Broadway street with full intersections, from the north line of North Mill creek to the north line of Madison street in the following manner:

By establishing a permanent grade on said street along the proposed line of improvement where not already established.

By placing the street railway track of the Oregon Electric Railway company where it extends along the proposed line of improvement in the center thereof.

By grading the roadway of said Broadway street between said points full width from curb to curb with full intersections to the proper subgrade.

The subgrade shall be one foot below the established grade and upon said subgrade shall be placed one foot of clean creek or river gravel, provided however, the space along the center of said street to be occupied by the said Oregon Electric Railway company shall be graded in such a manner that the top of the rail of said company will be on a level with the established grade of said Broadway street.

The cost of placing said track in the center of said street and improving between the rails and one and one-half feet outside of the rails of the Oregon Electric Railway company, to be assessed on the abutting and adjacent property, as provided in the charter of said city.

The cost of said improvement, save and except the space between the rails and one and one-half feet outside of the rails of the Oregon Electric Railway company to be assessed on the abutting and adjacent property, as provided in the charter of said city.

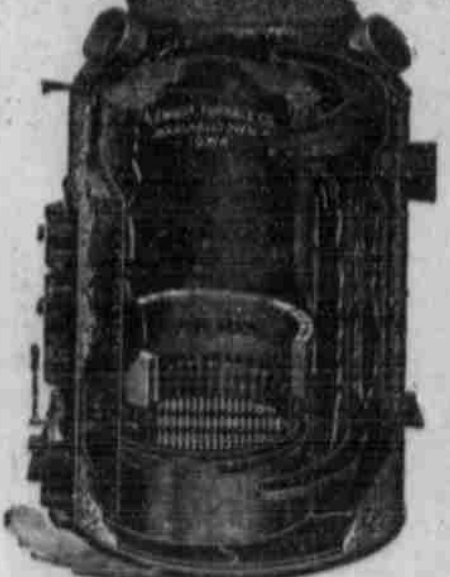
