### COOS BAY: SEES PROPERTY

K. I. Perky Tells of His Trip to Coos Bay Country.

K. I. Perky, who has just returned home from a trip to Coos Bay, told a Boise Capital News reporter of his pleasant trip from Coos Bay down the river and around

to the bay, of the progress that is being made on the bay and of the hopeful feeling of the people there as they look at the future. "There would be nothing new to say of the trip down the Columbia," said Judge Perky, "had it not been taken during the period of the equinox, when nature seems to be in a disturbing mood. This proved to be true on this trip, for it took two

days and nights to make a distance which otherwise should be made in about 27 hours. It was a storm, and that for sage-brush people tells the tale.

"The entrance into Coos Bay, however, was one of gaiety, as the day of our arrival was the day of the arrival of the largest lumber carrying vessel on the Pacific, and this vessel had reached the bar about one hour ahead of the Alliance, and in honor of the coming of this schooner, Nann Smith, the city of Marshfield had declared a holiday and the bay was alive with the launches, gaily decorated and with bands aboard, so that the scene was a very beautiful one.

"The arrival of this schooner marks a new era in Marshfield prosperity, as this is the property of C. A. Smith, the owner of the large lumber mill, the second largest in the entire United States, located in Marshfield, on the bay, and will carry the product of his mill to other ports. She carries on each trip 2,225,000 feet of lumber. This is the largest vessel that has ever entered Coos Bay.

"I found a most beautiful little bay situated on the hills around the bay, with ranches nesting all around the bay and river with the trees in bloom, the ferns nodding their graceful leaves and the evergreens of many varieties keeping watch upon every hillside; with the beautiful myrtle trees; with the bay and river constantly alive with the launches of the ranchers who bring their produce to market in this novel way, with the passenger steamers plying up and down, with the fishermen making his daily catch, and with the steamers from San Francisco, from Portland and from Eugene, loading and unloading their cargo—bringing in numbers of passengers and much merchandise, and returning loaded with coal from the coal field of Marshfield, which finds a market all along the coast, and is the only coal mine in this country which loads its vessels from its own docks.

"I attended a meeting of the Chamber of Commerce while there, and listened to speeches from numerous parties who are all united in feeling that this is to be a metropolis of the coast.

"With the harbor deepened, for which an appropriation has been recommended to congress; with the second largest lumber mill in the United States; and with unlimited material to work from, with its own vessels for shipping, now employing over 1000 men, and expecting to increase this number to 4000, many of them with families, which will have to be provided with homes and with coal mines, whose supply seem to be inexhaustible; with the most fertile land, especially suited to growing and fruit growing, their pride being that they have no wormy fruit; and with factories strating for the utilization of the native lumber, some of which is the beautiful myrtle; with the people who believe in their country and know the reason for the faith that is in them; with a climate that varies but a little over 12 degrees the year around, one can understand why they are expecting so much from their country.

"While in this delightful spot, I forced to admit that his efforts at

"The prospects for the railroad never seems to have been brighter, as the company has contracted for much of the produce along the right of way and they are more than hopeful of its completion in the near future. The entire country around the bay is one garden spot and most picturesquely located; many modern homes, many having their private launches, and summer homes down the river, where nature seems to have done her best for making a spot for recreation and with prosperous commercial conditions, they seem a favored people in many ways."

The Columbia river, the greatest fishing stream in the world, with its hatcheries and divided interests over which Van Dusen has charge has, during the past few years, almost proved a failure, and Van Dusen is

propagating fish on that stream, or its tributaries, have proved a dismal failure, and the immense amounts of the state's money he has expended have gone for naught. Even his best friends have deserted him, and the spectacle of his being compelled to go to Salem with only the walking delegate of a Puget Sound union to speak in his defense was nothing short of humiliation.

Pleadings, prayers and implorings to hold his job have proved of no avail and he is now down and out, to the infinite satisfaction of the general public and those vitally interested in the fish business. That he has not been removed before can only be laid to "politics," but the present board of Fish Commissioners, namely, Governor Chamberlain, Secretary of State F. W. Benson and State Treasurer George Steele, are to be congratulated on their decision.
