There was a fine compliment to elect veteran public spirited banker H. Albert president of the Board of Trade. Mr. Albert has the right stuff in him to make a president and will add to his reputation for progressive work by his administration.

The New British Patent Act, the first day of this year a set came into force in this country, one that within a month brought the business instinct of nations to a sharp understanding of the value of possessing a keen commercial brain at the head of a Board of Trade. The new patent act in a month's time has done as a direct consequence of the working of all patents granted in this country within our own borders was first brought before the Board of Commerce. The annual meeting of the Board of Commerce in 1907 to 1908 a resolution was passed on the subject. Finally a bill was introduced upon which Mr. George. They introduced a bill and succeeded in introducing the president of the Board of Trade that he at once formed a committee, and finally he passed through the admirable act of the new act, and there is no doubt from it. Every patent granted in the British Isles will be worked in the British Isles. Further, the act is retroactive, and all patents taken out

in 1904 and before that date will by the 28th of August this year, be compelled to show cause why they should not be made to work their manufactures in this country. We have granted something like 8000 patents to foreigners. Many of these are not worth very much, but a large number are very valuable.

It is rumored that a large American machinery firm is now here looking for suitable land for the purpose of manufacturing all the tools for which they have British patents. Another American firm holding British patents for safety razors will in a few months be finding work for 500 hands at Sheffield. Another company has bought land in London, and all this in four weeks' time. One can already compute that 10,000 additional work people will be directly employed 12 months hence as a result of the amended patents act.

But we shall never hear of a great number since, when it is not considered essential to erect works of their own, the right to manufacture will have to be delegated by foreigners to British firms. Finally, when all these patents lapse we shall have definitely established concerns here ready to continue the industries. Fortunately the new act, unlike its preceding ones, is so definitely and clearly worded—especially in this case with section 27, which deals with the revocation of patents worked outside the United Kingdom—that there are no loop holes to afford escape from it. The industries about to be created will become British industries.—Dublin Sunday Chronicle.

EIGHT TRIBES TO JOIN IN REVIVAL

Indian Meeting on Tutuilla to be an Event — Tutuilla Presbyterian Church Sends Out 500 Invitations to Northwest Tribes.

Eight tribes of northwest Indians will participate in a monster revival meeting which will be held at the Tutuilla Presbyterian Indian church on the Umatilla reservation six miles from Pendleton from April 30 to May 10.

It is expected that at least 500 visiting Indians will be present. Eight native Nez Perce ministers will take part in the revivals and the encampment will number perhaps 100 tepees, at the Tutuilla church.

Rev. J. M. Cornellison is in Pendleton making arrangements for the printing of 500 invitations to be sent out, these to be in the Nez Perce tongue. The Nez Perces, Warm Springs, Spokanes, Yakimas, Flatheads, Bannocks, Blackfeet and other northwest tribes, will be invited to the reunion and revival.

All the exercises, programs and hymns will be conducted in the Nez Perce language, the common language of the tribes, and it will be an event in the history of Christianity among the northwest Indians.

The camping ground is being cleared off now and preparations for the meeting are under way. The ministers will be entertained by Rev. Cornellison at the mission and everything will be done to make the meeting successful and pleasant.

The rallying song for the revival will be "The King's Business," which will be printed in the Nez Perce language on all programs. The chorus of this song is as follows:

Ki hiwash taaiskt, tamaitsa.
Ki tats wenpit Haangelsinim.
Shepenimuinin, hithisa Intim Lord
Shepehimuinin, witseth.
