ATTACKS ALDRICH

(Continued from page one.)

Bankers' association had been "bought" by Wall street to agree to a compromise on the Aldrich financial bill now before the house.

The currency commission came to Washington determined to bring about the defeat of the measure, but Crosier declares it has suddenly changed its mind in a most peculiar manner. He did not mention any names in making the charge, adding that he was enabled to obtain his information because a banker, who addressed the house committee yesterday, mistook him for a banker.

In opening his statement Crosier said that it cropped out yesterday that the bankers are dissatisfied with the 6 per cent tax on emergency currency and that they hold this emergency wrong in principle and would be dangerous in practice.

"But at 10 o'clock last night our distinguished banking friend held a conference," declared Crosier.

"Today they are holding another conference with the wicked promoters of the Aldrich financial bill to agree to a compromise.

"They are now holding out for an amendment reducing the tax to 3 per cent. It appears to me that Wall street knew its quarry and was familiar with the best way to work it, to get support for the pet measure of that paradise of gamblers."

Crosier then attacked the financial bill, which has already passed the senate, as a law giving Wall street the power to create a money panic at will and thereby terrorizing with
