SHEEP MEN DON'T WANT REDUCTION OF HERDS

By petition drafted by the executive committee of the Oregon Wool Growers' Association, the forestry bureau is asked to forego making any cut in the number of sheep to be allowed upon Oregon reserves this summer and some good reasons are set forth why the request should be granted.

In brief the sheep growers hold that owing to the present state of the sheep market it would be injurious to the wool growers to have to sell off any of their band this spring, and they ask the government to omit the cut unless the market improves. It has been the intention of the forestry people to make a cut of 10 to 20 per cent of the number of sheep that were allowed on the ranges last summer. If this stand is adhered

to approximately 100,000 sheep will be forced onto the market on account of the fact that there will be no range for them.

According to the petition of the executive committee, which is most courteous, the ranges sufficed for all of the sheep last summer and they will again if the forestry bureau will but allow the sheep to go upon them.

The executive committee was in session in the office of Dan Smythe, secretary of the state sheep commission and of the state woolgrowers' association. Aside from the above proposition it has also been considering other subjects. Among them is the question of foot rot and action was taken toward having the sheep commission take up the fight against that disease.

TRIED TO SAVE RABBIT

Carson, Nev., April 18.—The sad story of a five-year-old boy who tramped twelve miles through the hills in search of a pet rabbit and then fell dead from thirst and hunger is unfolded through the discovery today of the lifeless body of Donald Peckham on the summit of Mount Davidson.

Donald, who was the son of James Peckham, employed in the office of the attorney general at Reno, wandered from his home Thursday night hunting for a rabbit that had disappeared among the hills near Virginia City. Searching parties were organized, but no trace of the boy was found until six o'clock this morning, when his body was found on Mount Davidson, twelve miles from home.

DURRANT'S SISTER IN LONDON

San Francisco, April 18.—A story published here today stating that Maude Allen, the sensational dancer, who has electrified London, is none other than Maude Durrant, sister of the vilest murderer in California's history, Theodore Durrant, created a stir among the young woman's school day friends, who had practically forgotten the girl whose blood ties brought her into such unenviable notoriety 13 years ago, then a mere slip of a miss.

At the time of her brother's trial for the murder of Blanche Lamont and Minnie Williams, the girl's name was fouled, but all of the vile accusations to which she was subjected have since proven unfounded.

When Durrant was hanged his sister was in Europe studying music. Inasmuch as her parents were poor, her father being a shoemaker, it was reported that the girl's expenses were being paid by a millionaire, since deceased, but her parents de-

nied this, saying she was paying her own expenses by selling a patent set. As a musician and singer she did not succeed and she took to dancing. Then came success and today she is the favorite pet of London. Miss Allen's greatest hit is the "Dance of the Seven Veils" when she strips herself of the veil, and body upward from her waist, and reaches the climax of the sensational dance from "Salome" but she has eliminated the passionate pose imparted to it by other dancers.

Circuit Court.

Chas. Wright, the horse-thief who has served three sentences before for the same offence, was this morning sentenced by Judge Burnett to seven years in the penitentiary for stealing a horse belonging to Charles Yately. Jack Wilson and L. Smith, who were convicted of breaking into and hobbling Dillman's second-hand store on the night of January 22nd, were each given two years.

Hans Z. Hansen, who was brought back from New York by Sheriff Culver, and subsequently convicted of stealing a team of valuable horses from Wm. T. Claggett, though stating he had not been given a fair trial and that he could produce witnesses to show he was the wrong party, was sentenced to three years. Arthur Hitchman, who was convicted of assault on Carry No'an three years ago, when he was 16 and she was nearly 15 years of age, will be given a respite until May 1st to produce testimonials as to his character in order that he may be paroled.

W. H. and Webster Holmes have been ordered by the circuit court to return \$82.50 to Levi Cole, as administrator of the estate of Levi Battines, which money was paid to the attorneys to pay in turn, to Alice Davis Pressler, the plaintiff in a suit against the estate.

District Attorney McNary has gone to Tillamook to try a man named Hembre, who some years ago is alleged to have killed his wife and daughter and then burned his cabin, near Sand Lake. Hembre was found guilty of manslaughter, given an indeterminate sentence and subsequently paroled. Public clamor resulted in his being arrested again on the charge of murdering his wife.

Sanitary Food Ordinance.

City Attorney Keyes, at the instance of the hospital and health committee of the city council, has prepared a bill compelling fruit and meat dealers to keep their supplies covered when they are brought into town in wagons. Heretofore the loads of meat and fruits, especially berries, have been brought into town with a swarm of flies and a cloud of dust settled on them. The ordinance provides that any violation of it will be punishable by a fine of \$5 to \$20 or from two to five days in jail.

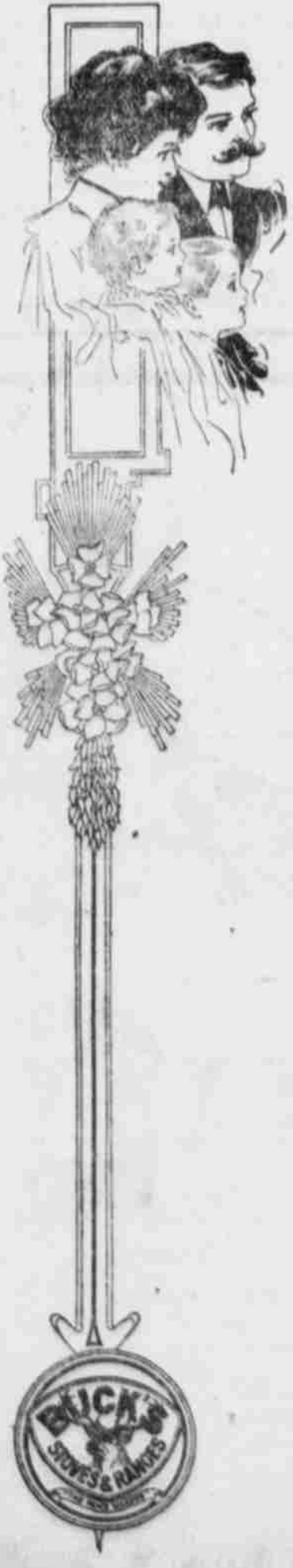
