## AMONG THE SAWMILLS OF OREGON

### New Plants, Changes and Improvements Throughout the State.

(From the Timberman for April.)  
 Arness & Son, Myrtle Creek, have installed a Berlin planer in their sawmill.  
 Silvertown Lumber Company, Silvertown, has installed a Grinnell automatic sprinkling system.  
 The Bond planing mill at Myrtle Creek has been purchased by N. H. Lamb and C. D. Pullin.  
 Tichenor Mill Company, Clatskanie, resumed operations in their camps and sawmill early in the month.  
 Miami Lumber Company, Hobsonville, resumed operations April 6, after being closed down for some time for repairs.  
 The Patterson Lumber Company, of Rainier, recently shipped an order for 500,000 feet for delivery at Redondo, Cal.  
 Dan Salzer and Austin Sagner have purchased the interest of M. E. Dunn in the Wildwood Lumber Company, Wildwood.  
 Sheridan Lumber Company, Sheridan, has started up its mill. Additional dams are being constructed to facilitate log-driving.  
 The Oregon Lumber Company's plant, Baker City, resumed operations March 26. The plant had been idle since early last fall.  
 W. H. Hicks & Co. are installing a 20,000 capacity sawmill near Hood River. Portland Machinery Company, Portland, furnished the equipment.

## NEWS OF THE MINES

Tennessee Copper is making a record which is arousing the interest and admiration of mining men everywhere. An up-to-date smelting plant is being erected on the company's property near Ducktown, Tenn. The company operates three mines, the ores of which are identical. Up to date the company has paid in dividends a total of \$1,806,250, but its net earnings have greatly exceeded this amount. Its large production and low capitalization—only 200,000 shares—will enable it to make a tremendous record in coming years when the price of copper is high. The Leviohn family put up the greater portion of the money which paid for the property, its development and equipment; and while the stock is now selling above \$40 per share, it is a known fact that the family still retain their original holdings.

**Salt Lake Copper.**  
 The stock of the new Salt Lake Copper company, a property of the Leviohn's, which has been very active since placed on the market, has developed near Tacoma, Nev., one of the country's highest grade bodies of copper ore. The earnings last year were about 5 per cent, and these were made on shipments by the primitive method of packing ore on mule backs. The mines are now connected with the Southern Pacific Railway by an aerial tramway three miles long and four miles of a standard gauge road. It is estimated that about 240,000 tons of ore are blocked out, and about 24,000 tons were shipped during the past year. The company is capitalized at \$2,200,000; the par value being \$10, and 2,000 shares being held as treasury stock. The stock is now selling between \$11 and \$12 per share.

**North Butte Extension.**  
 President W. T. Van Brunt of the North Butte Extension Copper Company has received a letter from the mines, informing him that a rich vein has been uncovered at the 500-foot level while putting in the last station set 31 feet south of the shaft. The stock of the company has been active during the week on news of the rich strike. Boston houses have been very heavy buyers.

**Butte and New York.**  
 Bennett Minzesheimer, member of the Stock Exchange will accompany a mining engineer to the property next week. The engineer is to make a thorough examination for some wealthy brewers in New York City, and if his report is satisfactory, these capitalists intend taking a large block of the stock, which is now selling between \$2 and \$3.
