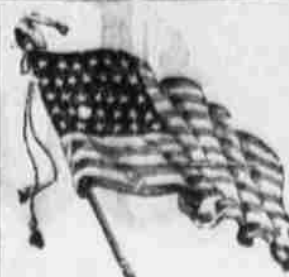

The mystery of her fate and the madness of the passion of the man who killed her are not matters for human judgment to pass upon.

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## BIKE NEWS

The Birmingham, Ala., Motorcycle club, which is one of the liveliest sporting organizations of the Southland, is planning a series of motorcycle races to be given on April 25, at the state fair grounds. Something over a score of entries are registered, including a number of out-of-town riders from New York and other eastern cities. The proceeds of the meet will be applied to the building of a club house.

**Veteran Cyclers Active.**  
One of the veteran cycling clubs which has clung to the wheel with old-time enthusiasm is the Bushwick Wheelmen's club of Brooklyn. This organization dates from 1891, and after meeting in modest quarters on Bushwick avenue for a couple of years, founded a club home in 1893. In 1897 it was incorporated and moved into larger quarters. Its membership is growing again as the result of the renewed popularity of the wheel, and the club is a leader today among Brooklyn's cycling organizations.

**Boston's New Motorcyclers.**  
A new motorcycle organization has been formed in Boston, which will be known as the Massachusetts Motor club, and is composed of devotees of the sport in Greater Boston. Arrangements have been made to hold the club's first road meet on April 20. The riders will leave Copley Square at 8 a. m. over the following route: Waltham, Weston, Scitbury, Marlboro, Shrewsbury, Worcester, Framingham and home.

**Old-Timers Awheel Again.**  
More than eighty riders who were formerly prominent in cycling circles, have perfected an organization in Philadelphia under the name of the Veteran Wheelmen's association. The first outing of the veterans is scheduled for Saturday, May 9, when a run will be taken to the Audubon (N. J.) Country club, where the old-timers will be entertained. The run will be under the leadership of Captain William Ott.

**Cycling On Victoria Day.**  
Arrangements are being made to make the annual bicycle races on Victoria Day notable events, says a Dominion paper. This holiday falls on May 25th, and is usually the first important date for athletic sports in the Canadian calendar. At St. Thomas the bicycle races will be promoted by S. McCredie and Dr. E. W. Housinger. A relay race from Aylmer to St. Thomas promises to be an interesting event.

**Gathering for Salt Lake.**  
The spring bicycle training days are now on at Salt Lake, and it is already evident that the amateur list this year will be much larger than usual. In addition to native talent, a big string from Australia will be on hand when the season opens. Among the pros, who will ride are Frank Kramer, N. C. Hopper, F. A. McFarland, Clark, Pye, Hardy Downing, T. M. Samuelson, Joe Folger and a number of others.

**IN JACKSON COUNTY**  
Investigation of the accounts of the county superintendent of schools office at Jacksonville show that P. H. Daily, who last January resigned as county superintendent, was a defaulter in school funds to the extent of nearly \$1000. Part of this shortage was discovered recently by J. Percy Well, Daily's successor. Part of it has been known by county officials for months, but carefully concealed from the public. It is reported that further investigation will reveal more discrepancies. Daily left the county months ago, and his exact whereabouts are not known, the answer to inquiries regarding him being that he is in a sanitarium somewhere for his health. Although several months have passed, his bondsmen have not paid the county a cent, and no proceedings have been taken to prosecute Daily.

In case said sidewalk is not laid in accordance with said resolution by May 30, 1908, the city of Salem will proceed to construct the same and assess the cost thereof against said real premises and declare the same to be a lien upon said premises in the charter of said city and ordinance No. 452, provided.

To improve a portion of N. Cottage street, D street and Beech street in the city of Salem.

Notice is hereby given that at a regular meeting of the common council of the city of Salem, Oregon, held April 20, 1908, a resolution was adopted to improve North Cottage street in the city of Salem, Oregon, between the north line of North Mill Creek and the south line of D street; D street in the city of Salem, Oregon, between the north line of North Cottage street and east line of Seventh street; Beech street in the city of Salem, between the north line of D street and south line of the Fair Grounds in the following manner:

By establishing a permanent grade on said streets between points.

Said improvement shall be continuous and extending from the north line of Mill creek to the south line of Fair Grounds Road, and said grade along the center thereof for a depth of 16 feet shall be excavated to a depth of 10 inches below the grade of said streets, and when so excavated, shall be filled with sand, creek or river gravel, so that the face of said improvement shall be level with the grade of said streets. Said dirt so excavated shall be used in making a uniform grade on said street for full width will have proper drainage.

The cost of said improvement shall be assessed on abutting adjacent property, as provided in the charter of said city.

Remonstrances against the improvement may be filed with the city clerk within ten days from the date of the publication of this notice.
