State Street Paving.

Work will commence early next week on paving State street, hauling crushed rock having been ordered to begin. Requisition was made by Manager Page for \$25,000 on his company for the streetcar company's part of the work on State, Commercial and Liberty streets, but it has only been honored for state, and the material for that part is shipped. But it is believed the Portland corporation will come through in time with the rest. The warm summer months are best adapted to laying the bitulithic pavement, and the work will be pushed when started.

All kinds of street improvement discussion are in the air, and all the time the street department and the city engineering department are busy getting out the details of the work. In the meantime the general citizen is anxious to see the wheels go round and see the work begin on the real work. Orders have been made, contracts have been let and streets have been ordered cleared, but no real paving is going down. SERVICES

The Easter services in all the churches were well attended and in some places many were abled to stand. The music in the various churches was pronounced a success by all those who had the pleasure to listen to it.

The minor strain of the music through the "Fearful Hour" was well pictured by the chorus. The parts of Mary weeping at the tomb and the angel at the door of the tomb were well executed in a contralto solo by Mrs. J. R. Comer and in a baritone solo by Mr. H. S. Gile.

The soprano and contralto duet by Mrs. Comer and Mrs. Hug beautifully portrayed in well blended voices, "The Risen God." The male chorus rendered in an excellent manner the scene of the crowning of Christ as "King of Kings." In the final scene "Praise His Name," of the cantata Mr. Chas. Roth, the young conductor of music, showed his splendid ability to draw forth from the chorus the necessary spirit and volume of music under the masterly direction of his baton. There were several other musical selections on the program and all were so well executed that it was pronounced by the very large audience present a musical treat.

Owing to the illness of some of the members of the Beaver Quartet they were unable to render their music as expected, in the First Congregational church. One of the members, however, gave a vocal solo "Hosanna" (Gaines) and this being the same which Mrs. Carleton Smith had prepared, she did not sing.

Brackett) in the morning at the Presbyterian and during the offering a selection will be rendered by a string quartet composed of the following members: Miss Joy Turner, first violin; Frank Frickey, second violin; Will Ketchum, viola; and Lou's Stelhammer, cello. Evening—Vocal solo, "Oh, Savior of the World" (W. Buck) Mrs. Mermie Hug.
