Transfer Hembree Case—
District Attorney John H. McNary this morning returned from Tillamook City, where he has been engaged in the preliminaries for the trial of A. J. Hembree for the murder of his wife on Christmas night, 1907. The circuit court has ordered a change of venue, and the case has been transferred to Polk county be-

cause of prejudice in Tillamook county. Hembree was found guilty of manslaughter for the murder of his daughter on the same fatal night, but was subsequently pardoned. Public sentiment forced him to trial the second time.
