SANTA BARBARA DISPLAYS DISRESPECT

(United Press Leased Wire.) Santa Barbara, Cal., April 28.--Scant courtesy to the officers, more scant to the enlisted men and none at all for the newspaper men and writers who are with the ships is the record of the first day's official function making at this snug little village on the California coast. It costs \$12 a day for a room, 50 cents for a bottle of beer, 10 cents for a piece of pie and 10 cents for a postal card. When Admirals Thomas, Sperry and Emory and their subordinate officers returned the visit of the mayor there were less members on the reception committee than on the officers' staff. The admirals were presented with a box of crystallized fruit and a pot of carnations.

When the floral parade passed yesterday newspaper men and photographers were forbidden to appear on the line of parade because they were unable to provide themselves with white duck suits. The sailors are not happy. Today, a bunch of them wired Mayor Harper of Los Angeles: "Nothing doing here. Can't you get us transferred back to Los Angeles?"

Society is being royally entertained at the exclusive cottages and hotels but the blue blouse boys and his officers are rather unenthusiastic about Santa Barbara.

Torpedo Craft at San Diego. Lieutenant Commander Cone states that the long voyage from Hampton roads has been satisfactory in every way. Only two deaths occurred among the crews, which number about 500 men, and one of these was accidental.

After a severe year battle, which he waged against the mighty traction and at time when the struggle appeared hopeless his efforts were crowned with victory shortly after midnight this morning, when the final papers necessary to the transfer of the operation of the streetcar company to the Municipal Traction company, fostered by Johnson, were exchanged. Johnson made his first fight for the 3-cent fares in 1901, within 10 days this fare will be in effect, with universal transfer within 90 days.
