Old Firm Incorporate—The Ladd & Tilton bank this morning filed articles of incorporation with the secretary of state, showing the institution to be owned and controlled by Wm. M. Ladd, Charles E. Ladd and John Wesley Ladd. The capital stock is represented at \$1,000,000 divided into 10,000 shares of the value of \$100 each. The articles, which were signed April 29, contain the usual provision for carrying on a general banking business.

This report shows that there were on hand April 1, 1558 patients, but that there was discharged during the month, 39; died, 15; and ran away, 1. The expense per patient for the month was \$12.90. The total expense of the institution during the period was \$11,144.10, of which the payroll amounted to \$8245.05.
