

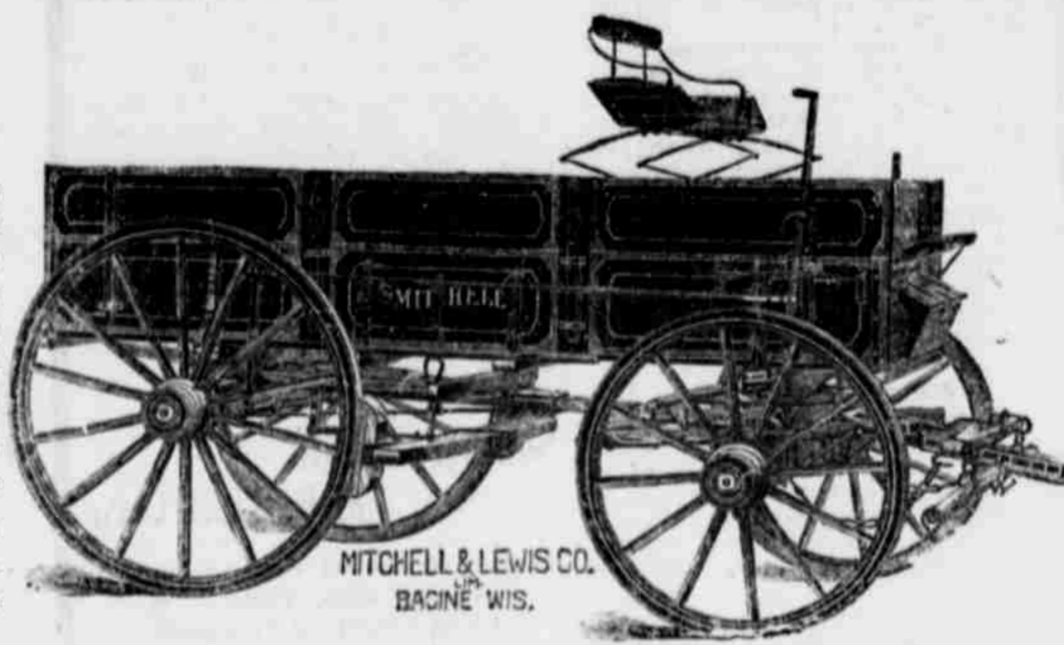

DYNAMITE FIENDS BLEW UP TRAIN ON BURLINGTON

(United Press Leased Wire.)

Butte, Mont., May 2.—Armed forces are today covering every bit of territory within a radius of 25 miles of Butte in a search for the bandits who blew up the Burlington car No. 6, a short distance west of this city last night and probably killed the engineer and tore the arms and legs of a man riding on the blind baggage. Whether or not the robbers secured any booty is not known here, a details of the holdup are being received in meager messages. Physicians and wrecking crews have been sent to the scene to care for the three men injured in the explosion and clear the track. The rain was being pulled by two engines, when suddenly a terrific shock threw passengers from their berths shortly before midnight, hurled the

two engines from the track and demolished three cars. The passengers rushed from the train to learn the cause of the trouble. A great pile of wreckage greeted them. Thomas and George Ehole, engineer and fireman of the second engine, were found by the side of the track badly injured. A search for Engineer Bussey, of the first engine, was quickly made, but he could not be found. It is thought that he is buried under his engine. In the midst of the wreckage of the coaches came loud cries for help. Carl Mauge, who was riding on the blind baggage, had been buried under the demolished cars and could not move. The passengers pitched in and rescued him within a few minutes. Both of his arms and legs were broken and his condition is serious. His escape from death was remarkable.

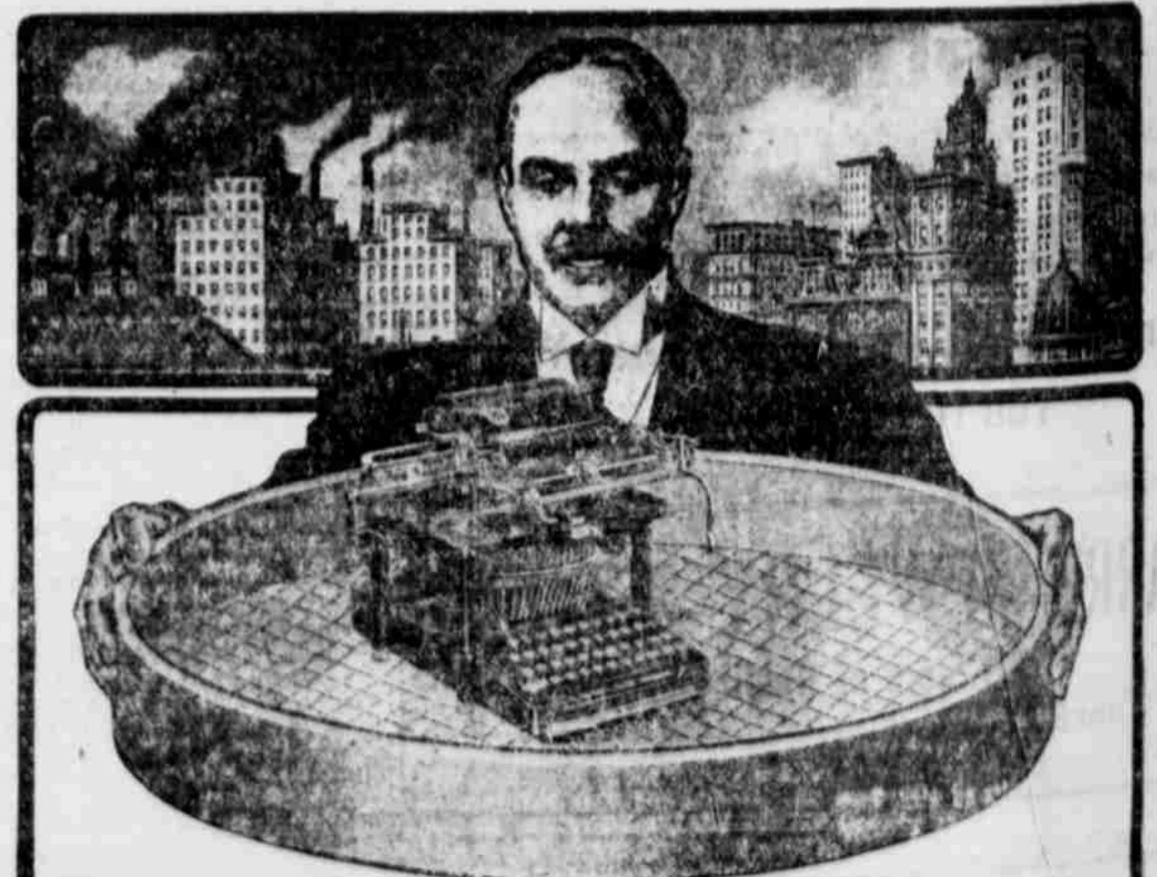
