BOLD ROBBERY IN CHICAGO

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Chicago, May 5.—One of the boldest robberies in the history of Chicago was perpetrated early today when four men entered a store in Woodlawn, a suburb on the South Shore, bound and gagged the watchman and carried away the entire contents of the store in a furniture van. As they drove away a citizen, who had been aroused by the outcry of the watchman before the men succeeded in gagging him, appeared at his window and emptied both barrels of a shotgun at the van but it is not believed that he struck any of the occupants.

The watchman was sitting in the store reading when the robbers slyly opened the door and entering on tiptoes rushed upon him. The watchman shouted for help and was instantly gagged, bound and carried to the rear of the store. The men then carried out all of the contents, whipped up the horses and drove rapidly away. The loot is valued at \$3500.

RUMORED GOULDS RECONCILED

New York, May 5.—There was a seemingly trustworthy report that Mr. and Mrs. Frank J. Gould had become reconciled, and that Mr. Gould had returned to the Fifth Avenue house, where Mrs. Gould has been living with her three children since the young couple parted.

No confirmation of the rumored reconciliation could be obtained at the Gould home, but it was the general belief among friends of the couple that their differences had been amicably adjusted and that proceedings looking to a separation will be dropped.

CONVICT ESCAPES FROM PEN

Richard Fritsch, a one year and a half man at the penitentiary made a successful escape yesterday afternoon about 5:30 while having the liberty of a trustee cleaning up the premises of the superintendent's cottage just outside the penitentiary fence.

When last seen, Fritsch was steady at his work, and just how he managed to slip out of sight of the officials cannot be learned, and owing to the fact that he was a trustee, no guard was deemed necessary which advantage he took advantage of. Several of the prison employees were securing the circus grounds last evening in search of the fugitive, and Warden Curtis took the second train out of here about 10 o'clock for Albany for the purpose of keeping a thorough watch in case the escaped should be on the trains leaving for points south, but nothing was found of him, and it is believed by the prison officials that he is yet in this city.

Fritsch was sentenced to one and a half years for obtaining money by false pretense, and he had the half year yet to serve. He was committed from Jackson county.

but was later released. A few days ago the suspected man sold his surveyor's instruments to a local stationery and book company.

The entire northwest is being combed in the search for Martin. A special description is being prepared for the cities around San Francisco bay, as it is believed Martin will try to lose himself in the crowds swarming in those cities at present.

Martin Will Surrender.

Edward H. Martin, accused of the murder of Nathan Wolff, the pawnbroker who was murdered Friday evening, called at the home of Mrs. J. J. Boyle at noon today and asked her to inform the police that he would give himself up at the central station at 5 o'clock this afternoon. He then disappeared.

Mrs. Boyle immediately telephoned Martin's message to Chief Gritzmacher.

Fifty police are now scouring the district in which the Boyle house is located and his arrest is expected at any moment.

"I am innocent," declared suspect Martin exclusively to a United Press representative 15 minutes after he was lodged in the city jail.

"I never committed the crime. The charge is too awful—it is horrible. What will my wife think? I can prove an alibi. I can do it by the testimony of my wife. I was with her at the time of the murder. I received these wounds in the hand by the scratch of a cat. The wound in my forehead came as the result of an axe handle breaking while I was splitting kindling Sunday.

"Sunday evening I quarreled with my wife, and for that reason I had been staying away from home. The shirt I bought at the pawnshop for rough work and threw it away after a single day's wear.

"I tell you I am innocent, as innocent as a babe in its mother's arms."
