San Francisco, May 5.—Admiral Evans, as he is riding north this morning to again take command of the great string of battleships, is passing the saddest moments he has experienced since he left Hampton Roads, for his favorite grand-son, Robley Evans Sewell, four years old, died at the home of his parents in Washington, D. C. When the admiral was flashed to Paso Robles last night the admiral was happy with the thought of rejoining his fleet and witnessing the great patriotic demonstration at San Francisco. The twinkling of an eye his whole life seemed to change. He was deeply heartbroken. All the joy of the coming reception had been taken from him. The sad thought of returning to Washington to find his little chum missing has overwhelmed the daring sea fighter with grief. "Bob" Evans, Jr., as he was familiarly known, and the admiral's like playmates when they were together. The little fellow was the youngest when attired in his sailor's uniform, he could sing sailor songs for his grandfather.

He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Sewell. Mrs. Sewell was Virginia Evans, the admiral's youngest daughter. Death was caused by typhoid fever.

Chicago, May 5.—The strange double life led by Mrs. S. Lemuel Schlotter ended today in an indeterminate sentence to the state penitentiary.
In Glencoe, a fashionable suburb, Mrs. Schlotter was known as the wife of a wealthy jeweler. Her automobile, her horses and carriages, her silks, jewels and furs were the envy of the Glencoe matrons.
Down in the Pearl street levee district Mrs. Schlotter was known equally well, but under another name. There she was known as Leona Garrity, the proprietress of a resort, where young girls were lured into white slavery.
Finally Belle Winters, a little 16-year-old girl, told the police a story which led to the arrest of Leona Garrity. Then it came out that Leona Garrity and Mrs. Schlotter of Glencoe were one and the same person.

BIG GRAFT SCANDAL IN BALTIMORE

Baltimore, Md., May 5.—Baltimore has a graft scandal which promises all sorts of startling revelations in addition to those already made.
Mayor McHool has so far removed from office J. Arthur Myckham, Democrat, and James H. Marine, a prominent Republican commissioner, for asking and receiving money for paying contracts. Several days charges against the two men and others have been under investigation. The hearing came to an abrupt end when Contractor John C. Robertson's charge that he gave \$1500 to former Congressman Rusk, who is said to have acted as a go-between in the deal while concealed in a book case.
A demand for \$19,000 for a contract led to the exposure. The president of the Maryland Paving Company was the informant. After admitting that he passed the money Rusk resigned last night.

lation to combinations, trusts and the cost of living.
Some weeks ago, before he was taken down with the severe illness that has compelled his absence from the senate, much of the session, the senator introduced a tariff commission measure, providing for a large and strictly non-partisan commission should be paid salaries; should be a permanent body, and should have the whole question of tariff schedules turned over to it, to be adjusted from time to time without fuss, feathers or political disturbance, as developing business conditions might demand. It was a proposal to take the tariff strictly out of politics.
In support of this measure, it is understood, Senator La Follette is likely to make a speech which will hardly be less sensational and unusual than was his recent money speech. He is expected to attack the present tariff system as responsible not only for much of the economic evil growing out of trusts and combinations, but also as responsible for a vast amount of political corruption.
