PREPARE FOR CLEAN UP DAY

Everything looks bright for the grand house cleaning day for Salem. Already the use of a number of teams have been offered the city for May 8, when school children and professors, employers and employees, society women and their housekeepers will all turn out and make this a cleaner city, and in so doing prove our civic pride.

The Board of Trade and the Women's club have both joined in the movement, and the former yesterday passed the following resolution:

"Whereas, The mayor of this city of Salem has issued a proclamation setting aside Friday, May 8th, as a Clean-up Day, when all citizens are urged to devote at least half a day to cleaning up their property, streets and alleys, and

"Whereas, There is great immediate need for such action throughout our city and such action will be of great assistance in prompting civic pride and in the future beautifying our city, be it

"Resolved, That the action of Mayor Rodgers in proclaiming a Clean-up Day for the city of Salem is heartily endorsed by the Salem Board of Trade, and this body urges every man, woman and child within our city to enter heartily into the spirit of this proclamation and thus assist in bringing about the present cleanliness of our city. It is urged that all property owners and residents of the city should not only be active in cleaning up their own premises and the streets and alleys about their places of residence and business, but they should also labor with their neighbors to do likewise.

"This spirit of making our beautiful Salem still more beautiful will do wonders in placing it in the front rank of America's most desirable residence and commercial cities. Every person should take pride in assisting the mayor and the city council in making this day a splendid success. It is also urged that teachers and pupils of the public schools apply this Clean-up Day

The Best Fishing In Oregon.

A correspondent at Sumpter says that without doubt "Olive Lake, a beautiful sheet of water near this place has earned the distinction of being the greatest trout habitation in Oregon. Thousands of fish are caught there each season by fishermen from all parts of the state, yet each season shows a larger increase of the fishy tribe. So numerous are the trout that the ordinary angler will be kept busy drawing them from the water with the only intermission the time that he spends in taking the fish from the hook and rebaiting it. Already some of Sumpter's hardy inhabitants are preparing to break the deep snow that lies on the highlands surrounding the lake so that they may be the first to make the phenomenal catch that rewards the early angler. Over ten thousand trout were caught on this lake last year by Sumpter residents alone and still there is not the slightest sign of any diminution in the number of fish there.

Downey Lake, a smaller body of water than Olive Lake is to be stocked with trout from the hatchery at Ontario. Baldy lake, situated near the summit of Bald Mountain, has also a large number of trout but anglers are not so successful there as at Olive Lake, as the fish will only bite under certain climatic conditions. This is considered strange as nowhere else in the Blue Mountains do the fish show this peculiarity. Some fishermen claim that it is owing to the great depth of the lake, and others that the right kind of flies are not used.—Ex.
