The Menace of the "Dreadnoughts." It will be a surprise to most Americans to know that Englishmen regard the Dreadnought as a mistake. Yet such is the statement made by Sydney Brooks in Harper's Weekly. In the old designs of ship, says Mr. Brooks, England possessed and could without too much difficulty maintain, her enormous lead. It was not to her interests to initiate a new type. If any other nation had conceived the Dreadnought then England would have been bound to follow, and if possible improve upon the example thus set. But it was none of England's business to set the example herself, to give a new spurt to naval competition and to invent a type of ship so manifestly superior to all other types as to make them not indeed obsolescent, but ineffective by comparison. "It is now pretty clearly realized that the building of the Dreadnought instituted a new scale and standard of naval rivalry which, instead of reinforcing, positively injures Great Britain's ascendancy at sea. The Dreadnoughts being in a class by themselves the stress of competition has been practically doubled. All nations with feverish unanimity have taken to building them; a vast amount of expenditure that would otherwise have been postponed or avoided is thus being incurred; new harbors, bases and docks have to be constructed for the reception and protection of these monsters. Great Britain finds herself committed to a struggle absolutely unprecedented for magnitude and expense in all naval history."

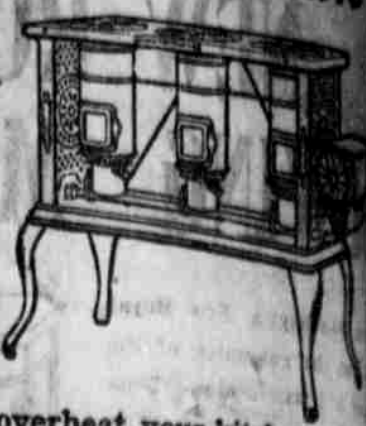
