Bryan, is slowly recovering from a fearful thrashing administered to him by a model named Canna, who beat Leavitt with a club in the court yard of the latter's studio. The artist turned on his assailant with a hammer which he picked up and fractured his skull. Canna is now in a precarious condition. Leavitt has asked for permission to carry a revolver for he fears that the attack of Canna was part of a plot to assassinate him. Canna was employed as a model by the artist, but as he could not satisfy him he was discharged. Leavitt says that on several occasions after that he gave the man money but when he declined to give him anymore he was attacked. A few days ago the artist says Canna tried to stab him with a long knife when he was refused financial assistance.

San Francisco, May 13.—The Greek-Americans of San Francisco have presented the flagship Connecticut, of the Atlantic fleet, with a handsome loving cup to show their appreciation of their adopted country.

The visitors were received Tuesday by Rear Admiral Thomas in his cabin where he received the token on behalf of the men and officers. In making the presentation speech the speaker alluded to the fact that there 300,000 Greeks in the United States, all of whom are loyal to their adopted country.

The cup is the most attractive ever presented to the Connecticut. It is about 20 inches high. Under the engraved flags of the United States and Greece is this inscription: "Presented to the flagship Connecticut, with greetings to the United States naval fleet from the Hellenic colony of San Francisco, 1908."
