The meet of the Western Oregon high school league which was to be held in Eugene has been changed to Salem and will probably be on May 23d. Besides Salem the high schools represented will be Eugene, Roseburg and probably Albany. Both Eugene and Roseburg have strong track teams and while Salem can hardly hope to win they are apt to put up something of a surprise to the visitors who think the high school here has little at all in the way of track material.

In this inter-class meet Kay proved the allround star carrying off first in all the dashes, hurdles and broad jump. Gabrielson and Niles were close second on the sprints, and Richardson and Hollingsworth proved the weight men Salem has also some good milers, half, and quarter men.
