Fairmont, W. Va., May 18.—At the conclusion of a revival meeting which he conducted, the Rev. G. S. Cossman, 50 years old and a prominent clergyman, returned to his home today, seized a butcher knife and cut the throat of his beautiful young wife. She died instantly. Cossman insists that the crime was committed during an attack of temporary insanity and that as soon as he gazed at the body of his wife on the floor before him he regained his reason. Mrs. Cossman was 30 years old. The couple was alone when the tragedy occurred.

Cleveland, O., May 18.—While being pursued by officers today after shooting his wife dead, John Bower ended the chase by turning about, facing his pursuers and killing himself with the same revolver that figured in the first tragedy. According to the story told by friends, Bower and his wife, Freda, quarreled early in the day and the woman fled to the home of John Hagner for protection. Bower followed her. Mrs. Bower, it is said, was conversing with Mrs. Hagner when her husband fired three shots, killing her instantly. Then following the chase in which Bower killed himself.
