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THE OBSERVANCE OF MEMORIAL DAY.

Becoming more and more a national holiday, Memorial Day awakens general public interest.

Its observance on next Saturday will be very general in this city AND WILL BRING THOUSANDS TO SALEM.

For two weeks there has been public and private attention to cleaning up the cemeteries everywhere.

The graves of private citizens as well as the dead soldiers WILL BE DECORATED WITH FLOWERS.

Thus has a national patriotic holiday to honor the graves of the heroes been extended to include all.

While time has mitigated the sadness of the observance, it has spread the custom to INCLUDE THE CIVIL AS WELL AS THE MILITARY DEPARTED.

It would be a beautiful custom if every private grave were covered with flowers, and at the same time all who carry such emblems to remember their loved ones, would carry some flowers for the graves of the soldiers also.

Might we not ask all of our readers, whether they have soldier relatives or friends, TO ALSO PREPARE FLOWERS FOR THE GRAVES OF THE DEPARTED HEROES OF AMERICAN WARS.

If that custom were established, or rather made general, as many observe it now, the result would be that the graves indicated on Memorial Day by the American flag would be buried with flowers.
