### Trade Schools Teach Obedience.

I wish to express belief that there is a fair solution to the problem of the technical school problem. The boys from these schools are somewhat different from others. A young man who has ambition and persistence enough to go through one of these schools is worth more than the ordinary "scrub" and is more capable; but in justice we must recognize that our shops have many youngsters made of just as good timber. The whole thing lies just here: How can we pay a uniform scale of wages until all men are born equal and alike? We must be satisfied at this stage of the world to accept differences; we can not all be President of the United States or superintendent of the works; but more of us than now seem to admit it could do better than we are doing, and could improve our position in the world by studying and attending to our own business. Knowledge is a power—a greater power than the card; the young man who will devote his spare moments to work out of time in the shop, practicing a hard job will come out all right. The boy who wants to do right will get proper instructions; he can get them if he really desires.

Returning to the trade-school boys; I want to point out an important point. They will try to run their tools and produce the work as directed by the foreman. You will notice that they have learned the lesson to obey at school, while the other boys have not learned this either in school or at home. This defect of home training is being felt throughout the whole country, in all departments of work, and what we shall do in the future for good all-around mechanics is a mystery to me. Many of our shops are willing to teach boys, but what do they get in return? When the apprentice has been in the shop about two years, he becomes dissatisfied with his pay and leaves to enter another shop as a journeyman. I believe that manufacturing concerns should require a written certificate as to the past whereabouts of men applying for positions; it would tend to correct this evil.—C. R. McCahey in Engineering Magazine.

#### A Fresh Source of Paper Pulp.

Englemann spruce is a comparatively small tree of rather slow growth whose range is on the high slopes of the interior mountain system from British Columbia southward to Arizona and New Mexico. Within this range it is used to some extent for lumber, mining timbers, ties and general construction, but it has not been considered a very valuable lumber tree and it is employed only because of lack of better material. No estimate of the total amount of standing timber is available, but reports of stands show more than one and one-half billion board feet as occurring on four of the national forests, and this is probably only a small part of the actual quantity standing. Throughout its entire range there is much material in the form of dead and mature timber.

The existence of such quantities of wood of seemingly little value has induced the United States Forest Service to undertake experiments to determine whether this wood can be used for making paper pulp. Samples have been received from the national forests of Wyoming, Colorado and Utah. These have been treated by the sulphite process and a pulp has been obtained, which, unbleached, is in color nearly as good as Eastern spruce under similar conditions, and in strength, cleanliness and other qualities seems to be equally as good. The results of preliminary trials on seasoned wood show that it cooks without difficulty and gives a yield of fiber nearly equal in volume to that from its Eastern relative. The amount of screenings is very small, being between 2 and 3

Tests made on the fiber show that it bleaches quite easily, the amount of bleach varying with different cooks, but in general it may be said to require about the same quantities as fiber produced from Eastern spruce. A few cooks have been made on green wood, cooked within two months from the time the trees were cut, and the indications are that it will require a little higher temperature than the seasoned wood. The fiber produced from green wood, however, seems to be fully equal to that from seasoned wood, and is superior to it in color. The fiber of the Englemann spruce seems to be slightly shorter than that from Eastern spruce, but it is of sufficient length to be used for the latter in nearly all the manufactured products, and there is apparently no reason why it should not be used, provided the other conditions of manufacture are favorable.

## LARGEST DRY DOCK FOR SOUND

Washington, June 3.—Revised specifications for the largest naval dry dock in the world, to be built at the Bremerton navy yard on Puget sound, were completed today by Rear Admiral Holliday, chief of the navy yards bureau. It is expected that the monster dock will be completed 18 months from July 1, when work is expected to be started. Bids for the construction of the dock have been asked and it is announced that they will be opened on June 18. The preparations are being carried on with dispatch and it is not thought that any delay will be permitted. The need of the big naval dock on the Pacific has been made clear by the visit of the Atlantic fleet.
