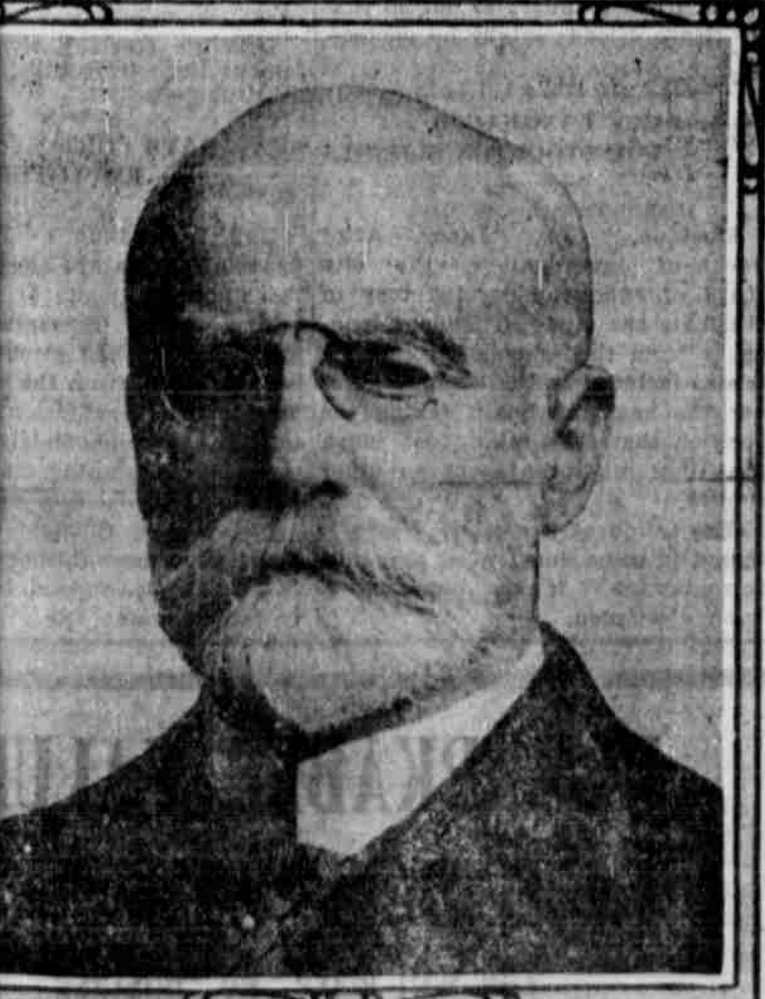

RED TAPE THE FOE OF EFFICIENCY.

Red tape is the foe of civil service which, after all, must be efficient service if it is not to prove itself worse than spoils service, since the latter is from time to time amendable to public opinion, while a bureaucracy wound up in red tape could hardly be reformed short of a revolution. The difficulty in practice is, of course, to prevent the public service from being loaded down with incompetents, the degree of whose incompetency is not easily defined in rules or ordinances. Often this incompetency is not disclosed until after employment. Often it is not to be ascertained by written tests. It is even difficult to formulate it in charges or prove upon trial. Yet it is there, a charge upon the public service.

Undoubtedly it is well that doubts should be resolved against the opportunities of political subterfuge masking itself as official discretion and zeal for efficient service. But efficiency must be definitely regarded and every means for preserving it considered. Chief Examiner Fowler's paper on the limitations of the written examination is excellent and his statement of the drift of policy in his State (New York) should be taken to heart by the jealous guardians of the merit system throughout the country. He says:

"We in New York State have substituted in some instances oral for written examinations. For instance in choosing attendants at many State institutions, like reformatory schools character and a love for the work are of prime importance. We found that many applicants who had no difficulty in passing the educational test were still, by reason of temperamental defects, quite unsatisfactory. Oral examinations supplemented with a close inspection of the personal character and experience of the applicants in fully two-thirds of the classes worked admirably. In general, too, I should say that more weight is now being attached to the moral tone and experience of the applicants."

The problem of red tape involves, however, not only the methods of examination, the terms of entrance into the public service, and the conditions of removal, but it also involves the larger problem of red tape in public administration. Perhaps this is deemed by the national assembly without their immediate concern and yet the ultimate efficiency of the merit system is inevitably bound up with the problem of efficiency in public administration. Certainly wherever a blow can be struck for economy, business system, and the allied merits of public service, it is the duty of friends of civil service reform to strike promptly and with all their might.—Chicago Tribune.
