### CHICAGO RECORD

#### MATCHMAKER

The record for June brides in the United States will be smashed this year, if the balance of the country follows the pace set on the first day of the month by Chicago's brides and grooms. No less than 165 licenses to wed were issued by the marriage license clerk before the month was a day old. Ordinarily about 75 or 80 licenses a day is a fair average; but this year apparently half the love sick swains in the city were only waiting for June to make the fateful dive into the matrimonial sea, and they flocked to the city hall in droves that kept the clerks of the department busy. If the record of the first day is maintained throughout the month, there will be a total of 4500 licenses by the end of June. This will eclipse the record of last June when 3308 licenses were issued. During the same period in 1906, the marriage clerk gave out 3103 licenses, while in 1905 only 2907 permits to marry were issued in the month of brides and roses. If this record is duplicated in the other cities of the land, the house furnishing stores will do a land office business in spite of reputed hard times. For the benefit of prospective brides, the weather man has issued a forecast of the climatic conditions they are likely to face on their first trip in double harness. According to Professor Cox, the head of the local weather bureau, the average record for the last 37 years indicates that matrimonial venturers may expect only nine days on which the sun will shine all day. Fourteen days will be partly cloudy, offering the newly-wedded a mere chance of being blessed by the good omen, while seven days will be entirely cloudy, with 3.57 inches of rainfall. From the facts gleaned from weather history, June has shown in the past an eccentric disposition, so far as temperature was concerned. With these facts to guide her, the June bride will be able to choose her trousseau with a view to suiting it to the sort of weather she may expect to meet. Experts advise her to provide a rain-coat and a fur boa, as well as soft flimsy gowns for the warm days that are promised.

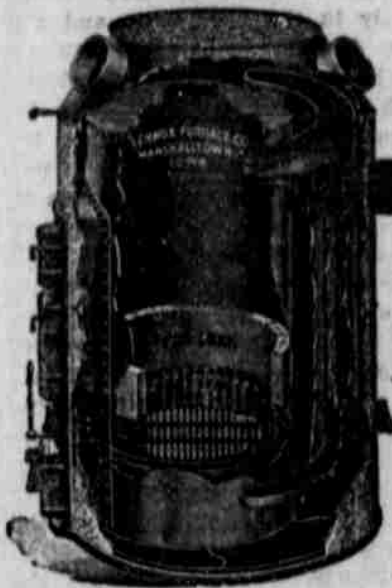
