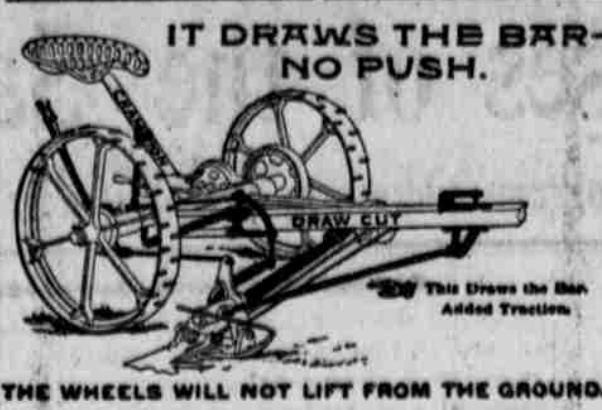

CHAMPION DRAW-CUT MOWER

IT DRAWS THE BAR—NO PUSH.
 THE WHEELS WILL NOT LIFT FROM THE GROUND.

The construction of the New Champion Draw-Cut Mower, which gives this mower its name, is very clearly shown in the illustration presented on this page. The draw rod extending from the inner shoe of the cutter bar to the pole is the foremost feature of this mower. This draw rod pulls the cutter bar over the ground from a point in front and also firmly supports it. The great cutting power which this mower possesses is thus explained, as it will be seen that the bar is not pushed from behind at all.

The construction of the New Champion Mower will be found all that is desired. The wheels on this mower are built high and strong, and are set just far enough apart to carry the width of cutter bar required. Perfect balance of the entire mechanism is assured because of the manner in which the gears are placed on the axle.

The great traction possessed by the New Champion Mower is obtained by this perfect construction and the fact that the cutter bar is drawn instead of pushed.

The perfect balance of the New Champion Draw-Cut Mower is one of the many distinguishing features of this mower and should receive the attention of every intending purchaser. When the cutter bar is raised to pass an obstruction there is no more neck weight than when the bar is on the ground in operation. The seat is adjustable forward and backward, and when the driver is very heavy, the seat may be moved forward until perfect balance is secured. On inferior mowers these features will not be found. In most cases the entire weight of the cutter bar when raised is thrown on the horses' necks.

BIG VERDICT AGAINST TACOMA WHEAT COMPANY

 Tacoma, June 13.—What is declared to be the heaviest damages ever awarded in a personal injury case in the district court of Tacoma or at least the largest in 16 years was returned against the Griffin Wheat company yesterday afternoon. After four hours of deliberation, the jury brought in a verdict of \$10,000 for John Smith, who was suing the company for \$20,000 for personal injuries sustained while in its employ. While a verdict in the plaintiff's favor was expected the amount of damages proved rather a surprise to the legal fraternity in the case.

Proposals Invited.

Proposals invited for supplies for the Oregon state penitentiary for the period ending December 31, 1908.

Sealed proposals for drugs, dry goods, groceries, butter, leather and findings, hardware, flour and meat, will be received at the office of the superintendent of the state penitentiary, until Friday, June 26th at 2 o'clock p. m., at which time they will be opened.

A deposit of \$200 in cash or certified check, payable to the superintendent, must accompany each bid for meat and flour, and all other bids must be accompanied by an amount equal to 10 per cent of the amount of the bid.

Samples to accompany all bids where practicable. The right is reserved to reject any and all bids and to accept or reject any portion of a bid. On each envelope should be inscribed the nature of the bid. Goods of Oregon manufacture or production will receive preference, other things being equal.

All goods and supplies must be delivered to the penitentiary within twenty (20) days after the contract is awarded.

Schedules of the various lines of goods to be bid on will be furnished upon application to the superintendent.

Vouchers will be issued for payment on the first of the month following the completion of contract, and monthly on continuous contract.
