## RELEASED ON GRAFT CHARGES

(United Press Leased Wire.)  
Harrisburg, Penn., June 13.—After deliberating 22 hours in the capitol graft trials, the jury early today returned a verdict of not guilty in cases of Congressman H. Bird Cassel, and Architect J. M. Huston, who were charged with having defrauded the state in the contracts for metallic furniture with which the \$13,000,000 building was fitted up. This makes five of the capitol graft cases which have collapsed.

conspiracy to murder Governor William Goebel. The same pardon bears Jim Howard, under life sentence in connection with the assassination in connection with the assassination.

Caleb Powers, a tall, keen young mountaineer, was elected secretary of state on the Republican ticket two years ago. William S. Taylor was the Republican nominee for governor and also declared elected. Goebel, the Democrat contested the election. The most terrifying scenes ever witnessed in this blood-marked capital followed. Goebel was shot down in the grounds in front of the capitol.

Powers, then 30 years old was arrested. Four times he was tried and each time he claimed the Democratic authorities in the state packed the jury with Democrats. His case aroused sympathy in every corner of the country and he received donations of money from almost every city and every post office. He never gave up hope. In his darkest days Powers dressed himself neatly, shaved and shined his shoes each day in his cell, as if he were going to his office. He has been called the American Dreyfus.

When the Republicans carried Kentucky last fall, it was immediately suggested that Governor Willson pardon Powers, but he said he would not unless he could be convinced of the prisoner's innocence. He made an exhaustive investigation of the case, with the result announced today. The pardons are unconditional.

The others ran screaming into other portions of the house, but re-loading her revolver as she ran, the insane woman followed them and killed them all, dropping one after another with her deadly aim. The cries and shots had by this time attracted the attention of neighbors and some ran into the house to see what was the matter. The woman met them at the door, and with a wild shriek, turned the revolver to her own head and sent a bullet through her brain.
