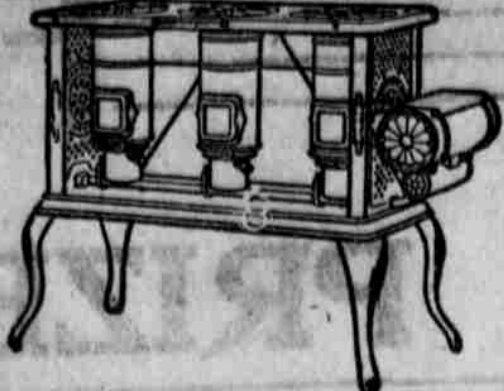


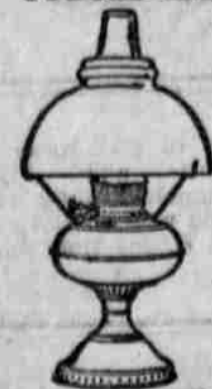

IN CONVENTION AT TURNER, OREGON

Christian Church in Annual Meeting June 22 to July 5.

Rev. F. E. Billington, corresponding secretary of the Oregon Christian Missionary convention, today announced that that body will hold its seventeenth annual session in the "Turner Memorial Tabernacle" at Turner, Ore., June 22d to July 5th. This convention will be attended by delegates and visitors from the 103 congregations of the Christian church in Oregon, representing a communicant membership of 10,500. The gathering will comprise a series of conventions conducted under the auspices of the various missionary, educational and benevolent associations of the church.

This year's convention promises to be one of the most interesting and profitable gatherings in the history of the organization. Among the speakers for the occasion will be President E. V. Zollars, of Oklahoma university; President P. L. Campbell of the University of Oregon; Dr. and Mrs. Royal J. Dye, of Bolenge, Africa; Dr. J. Whitecomb Brougher, of the First Baptist church, Portland, Ore.; National Secretary W. J. Wright, of Cincinnati, O.; Mrs. Louise Kelley, Emporia, Kan.; Rev. Thomas G. Pleton and Rev. E. W. Thornton, of California; President E. C. Sanderson, also Prof. E. C. Wigmore and Prof. H. T. Sutton, of the Eugene Bible university, besides several other prominent ministers and workers from the various congregations in the state and elsewhere.

All the sessions of the convention are open and the public is cordially invited to attend any or all of them.

OREGON UNIVERSITY TRAINER TO LEARN NEW WAYS

University of Oregon, Eugene, June 16.—The Associated Students of the University of Oregon will send "Bill" Hayward, Oregon's famous trainer, East this summer. Hayward will take six weeks in the Yale Summer School, perfecting himself in the most approved methods in training and physical culture and studying the best forms of gymnasium apparatus and equipment, and will also inspect a large number of the most prominent university, and other gymnasiums of the Eastern states. Hayward will be away from Oregon for a couple of months or more, and will have charge of the training of Dan Kelly and probably Forrest Smithson for the Olympic games. He will accompany the American team to London.

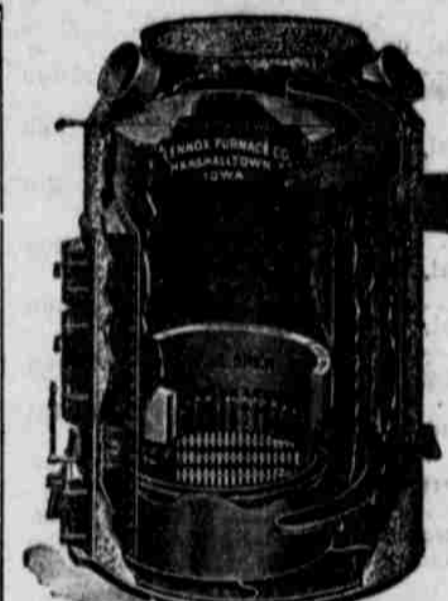
