POLITICAL TRICKERY

WILL NOT WIN OUT

Ed. Journal:—The reactionary and disgruntled Republicans still keep on asserting that Governor Chamberlain was elected by the democrats and a minority of foolish republicans, but I am inclined to think there is much room for doubt about that. It is mere guess work. There are not many Democrats in Clatsop precinct, and not all of them voted for the governor. Without making any inquiry beyond a half a dozen persons standing and conversing on the street, we could count 12 Democrats who voted for Mr. Cake. Presumably more did the same for on the road home I met another.

I did not ask why they did it, but presume they had reasons sufficient for them.

There is another item which may be mentioned: The judges in counting the ballots found over two dozen serious tickets. Chamberlain for the senate and the two anti-statement No. 1 candidates for the legislature; and without doubt the persons who cast such ballots were Clatsop Republicans.

Extend such a showing as this in all the precincts in the state and see what the result would be. Say 10 precincts in which ten Democrats voted for Mr. Cake, equal 100; and 20 Fulton Republicans voting for the governor, equal 12000. The purpose of the Fulton men in sending that sort of a ballot is, self-evident, but they missed the mark; the anti's were snowed under, but Senator Fulton is trying to debauch and dishonor the pledged Republicans of the legislature, which he should know is a hopeless task, for there is no one of them devoid of common sense or common decency. No one of them will be inclined to descend into the cesspool he is making for himself.
