TRY TO KEEP MEDFORD WET.

Colvig Retained by Prohis to Aid District Attorney in Fighting Case At \$1000 Fee.

(Medford Tribune.)

Arguments began this afternoon before Judge Hanna in the circuit court at Jacksonville over the temporary injunction granted J. C. Hall to restrain Judge Dunn from declaring prohibition in Medford on account of the special provision in the city's charter which gives the city council the right to regulate liquor traffic without regard to state laws.

The county is represented by District Attorney Reames and Judge Colvig, who has been retained to look after the prohibition side of the litigation, and the enjoiner by R. G. Smith of Grants Pass.

The county seeks to dissolve the injunction on the ground that the granting of such a restraining order is out in the jurisdiction of the circuit court. It is probable that the court's decision will not be given for some days.

The Medford prohibitionists have contracted to pay Judge Colvig a \$1000 fee to look after their side of the litigation for two years. It is understood that the money is being raised by contributions and that J. W. Cox and D. T. Lawton are among those who have donated \$100 each.

There promises to be no end to the litigation over the subject, and within a few days the county liquor dealers will begin action to declare the election void.

COLLEGE OF MUSIC COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES

Dr. Heritage, voice, and Prof. Arthur Von Jessen, piano, of the College of Music, presented a number of their pupils at the Grand opera house Monday night. The house was packed with a music-loving audience, and the selections which they heard were beyond expectation.

Professor Heritage and Mr. von Jessen have only been in the College of Music two years, but the standard to which they have raised music in this city was shown by the interpretations given by the pupils last night, and by the enthusiasm of the audience.

Dr. Heritage presented as his pupils, Miss Nina Pearl Johnson, Ruth Field and Helen Isabel Goodenough, who received diplomas; and Marguerite Mers, and Edna Earle Browning, who were given certificates. May Louise Hart and Ruth Field, pupils of Prof. von Jessen, were given diplomas, and Anna Frances Jackson, also one of von Jessen's students, received a certificate.

As the opening number, Marguerite Mers gave the Recitative and Aria from the opera, "Lombardi," by Verdi. She has a remarkably clear, sweet voice, which gives promise of greater things in the future.

One of the most brilliant numbers of the evening was the playing of Rigoletto, Verdi-Liszt, by Mrs. H. L. Ross. Although this is one of the most difficult of piano selections Mrs. Ross played it entirely from memory, and gave a splendid interpretation.

Mrs. Mernie A. Hug, who has won a high position in musical circles here, gave the Recitative, Aria and Cabaletto from the opera, "Traviata," by Verdi, in her wonderful voice, and was given an encore.

Helen Isabel Goodenough gave a scene and Aria from "Ernani," by Verdi. Her splendid work in this selection was evidence of her great talent, and the number was greatly appreciated by the audience.

Edna Earle Browning is a talented young singer who has not appeared before the public very many times, but when she has always met with the greatest enthusiasm, and Monday night was no exception. She gave the "Scene and Prayer," by Weber from "Der Freyschutz," in a very sweet, clear voice, the audience being able to hear every word of the song.

Others who appeared on the program were Anna Frances Jackson in a Romance in E. flat, by Rubenstein; Bertha Jennings in a selection from Chopin; May L. Hart, and Ruth Field in the Concerto in G Minor from Mendelssohn, and Nina Pearl Johnson in a vocal number, who is too well-known a singer to need any mention.

Prof. Heritage presented the class to Dr. Homan, the new president of Willamette. Dr. Homan spoke on the meaning of "Commencement," and said the students should look upon it in the whole meaning of the word; that it was but the commencement of greater things, that there was a vast field to work in, and that each person could always improve in any line of study.
