A very plain and sensible salutatory was spoken by Frank Sander of Tillamook. The next number was a clarinet duet by John Melchior and Sander, both of Tillamook, with accompaniment by Ambrose Walsh of Salem. "Killed at the Ford," by N. Van Ness of Ontario, was very well recited. A march by six small boys on the violin led by Rev. Joseph Schindler instructor in the violin department. The little fellows won a deserved recall. The address of the day was by Jas. Hennessy Murphy of Portland. He was introduced with some fitting remarks by the president of the col-



lege, Rev. Frowin Epper, in fitting words.
