### SPAIN AWAKENS TO HARM OF DENUDING FORESTS

Washington, June 29. — Spain, with China, has always been cited by forest experts as the "horrible examples" in referring to forest denudation. Almost total lack of forest cover has brought devastation from floods in both countries, and wreaked vengeance on the farmers by washing away the fertile humus, and lost the countries a great national resource.

Consul-General Ridgely of Barcelona, now writes the Department of Commerce and Labor that Spain is awaking to the necessity of growing her own timber. King Alfonso's land is as large as Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, West Virginia, and North Carolina all rolled into one, but its forests have only three-fourths the extent of West Virginia's alone—and much of them are merely scrub thickets of the poorest kind.

The country's population is believed not to exceed one-third of what it once was, or what it might be again. Much of the denuded land is absolutely barren, with red rock laid bare where agriculture once flourished. Hills, whose appearance indicate that they once supported forests, are bald and dry now, and without inhabitants. In some localities peasants, with hammers, pulverize rocks and make little patches of soil for gardens.

At the present time, Spain's most valuable forest product is cork. The annual cut is 30,000 tons, but the day is fast approaching when that will be cut off—and all for want of care. Enterprising Spaniards are just now trying to supply their country with home-made paper, but pulpwood is not to be had except by importation. When it is realized that pulp paper can be manufactured from wood as small as an inch in diameter, the almost total denudation of the forest; in the land of the Dons is apparent, taking into consideration the fact that the total yearly cut for this purpose is only 2,500 tons—just about the amount that an American pulp company would use in three days.

France is the "good example" pointed out when the forester speaks of reforestation. She has covered her barren places with new forests, restored the soil, abated floods, mitigated droughts, provided employment for a vast army of workmen, and furnished yearly an enormous total of raw material for manufacturers. Lying directly at Spain's threshold, she ought to furnish a splendid example for the rejuvenation of the Castilian empire.

### U. S. TRYING TO STOP

\$3,000,000 ANNUAL LOSS

Washington, June 29. — Sixty-three million dollars damage yearly through the ravages of the Texas fever tick among cattle, is the stupendous loss which the bureau of animal industry of the Department of Agriculture is endeavoring to stop.

The magnitude of the work is little understood. The quarantine line for cattle has until recently been steadily moving northward, an increasing territory opening up for the pests, and the already enormous damage being added to rapidly. Working in co-operation with the state authorities, the bureau of animal industry, under appropriation from congress, has already accomplished a wonderful amelioration of conditions. With the fiscal year beginning July 1, with an increased appropriation from congress of \$250,000, and confident anticipation that the states and counties where the work is undertaken will double that sum, there is every prospect that the dread quarantine line will be forced further back. Since the work was inaugurated, in 1906, an area of 56,000 square miles—or almost the size of the State of Georgia—has been entirely freed from the ticks.

Last year's work was done to a greater or less extent in Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Alabama, Tennessee, Kentucky, Missouri, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Texas and California, and during the coming year will be pushed even more vigorously.

Officials of the bureau declare that the damage caused by the ticks and the benefits to follow from their eradication are not generally appreciated. It is estimated that the Texas fever tick is responsible for about \$40,000,000 loss annually to people in the infected country, and that it lowers the assets of the South by an additional \$23,250,000, making the enormous aggregate of \$63,250,000.

Various methods for exterminating the ticks are used, including the transferring the cattle from pasture and dipping, spraying, and hand dressing with oil, and oil-emulsions. With large herds dipping is most usually the practice.
