TWELFTH STREET IS BOOMING

Salem's factory end. New lumber yard going in. Fifty women wanted at cannery. Selling a bill of lumber for a new house each day.

Salem's building boom passing all high water marks. At present rate five hundred new houses will go up this year.

New Lumber Firm. The Curtiss Lumber company with A. R. Baker manager has leased the yards and sheds of the Goodale Lumber Co., near the corner of Twelfth and Mill streets, and is putting in a million feet of the famous Mill City product. That company is a branch of the Hammond Lumber company that cuts 1,300,000 feet of lumber a day at its different plants.

Hickory Bark Factory Moves. The Hickory Bark Remedy Co., which located at Salem during the past year has bought the Monson property, corner of Twelfth and Mission streets and are moving their plant from State street to their new location. They moved 40 drayloads yesterday and are rebuilding the large red barn into a factory and warehouse with offices in front. They expect to fill three floors. The lot they bought is 70 by 84, and on the corner opposite the terminal grounds of the Oregon Electric railroad. There are things doing in that part of the city and it will become the factory end of the city. The Veget Bros. Co. are trying to get possession of a block of land on Fourteenth street, and will put up some business buildings if they succeed, as there is demand for business property in that part of the city.

Fire Blight Preventive. (La. Grande Observer). "Of all the troubles affecting the pear and apple, whether due to insect or fungi, there are probably none which equis in severity the fire blight," writes County Fruit Inspector Huffman. "Blight is very easily told. Ex-

amine the trees carefully, and you will see the ends of the limbs or leaves withering and turning black, the leaves still clinging to the dead boughs; and if the limb is cut where diseased a dark, sticky substance will exude, often running down the side of the limb or tree, thus affecting the part and spreading the disease. Birds or insects alighting on the same carry it to other trees and thus the farther spread of the disease.

"As blight works in the sap, it is hard to reach by spraying. So the most effective remedy is to cut out all affected parts well below any signs of the disease, and wash the cuts with a strong solution of blue stone and water. Also disinfect knives, saw, etc., by thoroughly washing in same solution.

"Be sure to burn all parts cut off to prevent further spread of the disease."
